- 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §1354, sub-§6, ¶B, as amended by PL 2003, c. 394, §3 and affected by §6, is further amended to read:

B. The Secretary of State shall develop and implement a standardized driver education curriculum for all classes of licenses under this chapter that establishes minimum standards for instructional goals and learning objectives, including mandatory education in the risks associated with impaired driving due to the use of alcohol, cannabis or other substances. The Secretary of State shall require distribution of information on organ and tissue donation and the possibility of saving lives through organ donation.

Sec. 2. Secretary of State to examine other jurisdictions. The Secretary of State
 shall examine laws, rules and other efforts of other jurisdictions to incorporate cannabis
 awareness within their driver awareness course curricula.

15 This bill requires that driver education instruction for all classes of driver's licenses
16 include mandatory education in the risks associated with the use of alcohol, cannabis or
17 other substances and requires the Secretary of State to examine the laws, rules and other
18 efforts of other jurisdictions to incorporate cannabis awareness within their driver
