1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §1804, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 2019, c. 113, Pt. A, §2, is amended to read:
4 5	1. Limit on length of probation. Except as provided in subsections 2, 3, 4, <u>4-A</u> , 5 and 6, the period of probation for a person may not exceed:
6	A. For a Class A crime, 4 years;
7	B. For a Class B crime, 3 years;
8	C. For a Class C crime, 2 years; and
9	D. For a Class D or Class E crime, one year.
10	Sec. 2. 17-A MRSA §1804, sub-§4-A is enacted to read:
11 12 13	<b>4-A.</b> Exception to limits when person sentenced for aggravated attempted murder. The period of probation for a person sentenced for aggravated attempted murder pursuant to section 152-A, subsection 2 is any term of years.

15 16	This bill amends the Maine Criminal Code to provide that the period of probation for a person sentenced for aggravated attempted murder is any term of years.
