## An Act to Support Maine's Public Health Objectives by Increasing Access to Hypodermic Apparatus Exchange Programs

- 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 2 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1341, sub-§1-A is enacted to read:

1-A. Additional county program locations. A hypodermic apparatus exchange 3 4 program certified under subsection 1 may operate in a location other than that authorized 5 in its certification, as long as the location is in the same county, the State is notified of the location and there is proper disposal of hypodermic apparatuses. Any additional location 6 must adhere to the requirements under this section and to departmental rules implementing 7 8 this subsection. The certified hypodermic apparatus exchange program shall submit 9 monthly reports to the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention with the additional locations the program is operating within the county, the number of hypodermic 10 apparatuses collected and disposed of and any other information requested by the Maine 11 Center for Disease Control and Prevention. 12

**SUMMARY** 

This bill allows a certified hypodermic apparatus exchange program, also known as a syringe service program, to operate additional locations within the same county as the certified program. The certified program must provide monthly data to the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention on the locations of additional sites, the number of hypodermic apparatuses collected and disposed of and any additional data requested. This places in statute the requirements of Executive Orders 27 FY 19/20 and 33 FY 20/21.
