Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §13073, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 534, Pt. A, §§17 and 2 19, is amended to read: 3 4 4. Legislative allocation of fund required. The Department of Economic and 5 Community Development shall submit to the Legislature, through the budget process as required by chapter 149, its recommendations for disbursement from the fund. The 6 recommendations must ensure that 10% of the available funds is provided on an equitable 7 8 basis to the federally recognized Indian tribes in this State. 9 Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §13073, sub-§5, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 534, Pt. A, §§17 and 10 19, is amended to read: 11 5. Expenditures from fund. Upon approval of the allocation by the Legislature and 12 approval of the allotment by the Governor, the State Controller shall authorize expenditures 13 from the fund as approved by the department for the following purposes: 14 A. Administrative expenses related to the fund; 15 B. Grants to cities and towns under the fund; and 16 C. Grants related to the fund and to other public and private organizations; and 17 D. Grants to federally recognized Indian tribes in this State in accordance with subsection 4. 18 19 Sec. 3. New Markets Tax Credit Program access. The Department of 20 Economic and Community Development shall develop, in consultation with federally 21 recognized Indian tribes in this State, a plan for ensuring those tribes have equitable access to the New Markets Tax Credit Program administered through the United States 22 Department of the Treasury's Community Development Financial Institutions Fund. 23 **SUMMARY** 24 25 This bill: 26 1. Provides for 10% of the available funds in the Community Development Block 27 Grant Program to be provided on an equitable basis to the federally recognized Indian tribes in this State: and 28 29 2. Directs the Department of Economic and Community Development to develop, in 30 consultation with federally recognized Indian tribes in this State, a plan for ensuring those tribes have equitable access to the New Markets Tax Credit Program administered through 31 the United States Department of the Treasury's Community Development Financial 32 33 Institutions Fund.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

1
