1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §8, sub-§2-A, as amended by PL 2019, c. 113, Pt. C, §57 and c. 483, §3, is further amended to read:
4 5 6	2-A. A prosecution for a Class A, Class B or Class C crime involving unlawful sexual contact or gross sexual assault <u>or a prosecution for a Class A or Class B crime involving aggravated sex trafficking</u> must be commenced within 20 years after it is committed.
7 8	This subsection does not apply to a Class D crime enhanced to a Class C crime pursuant to section 1604, subsection 5, paragraph B.
9 10 11 12	Sec. 2. Application. This Act applies to the crime of aggravated sex trafficking under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 17-A, section 852 committed on or after the effective date of this Act or for which the prosecution has not yet been barred by the statute of limitations in force immediately prior to the effective date of this Act.
13	SUMMARY
14 15 16 17 18	This bill extends the statute of limitations for prosecution of a Class A or Class B crime involving aggravated sex trafficking from 6 years to 20 years following commission of the crime. This change applies only to those Class A or Class B crimes of aggravated sex trafficking committed on or after the effective date of this legislation or for which the prosecution has not yet been barred by the statute of limitations in force immediately prior
