**An Act To Define the Intertidal Zone for the Management and
Enforcement of Shellfish Conservation Ordinances**

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6671, sub-§3, ¶A**, as amended by PL 2007, c. 494, §1, is
3 further amended to read:

4 A. Within any area of the intertidal zone within the municipality, a shellfish
5 conservation ordinance may:

6 (1) Regulate or prohibit the possession of shellfish;

7 (2) Fix the amount of shellfish that may be taken;

8 (3) Provide for protection from shellfish predators;

9 (4) Authorize the municipal officials to open and close flats under specified
10 conditions; and

11 (5) Specify areas of the intertidal zone in which the dragging of mussels may be
12 limited to the degree necessary to support a municipal shellfish conservation
13 program.

14 **Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6671**, as amended by PL 2013, c. 301, §14; c. 468, §31; and c.
15 517, §1, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:

16 For the purposes of this section, "intertidal zone" means the shores, flats or other land
17 between the high-water mark and the extreme low-water mark.

18 **SUMMARY**

19 This bill amends the law regarding municipal shellfish conservation programs to
20 clarify that the intertidal zone extends from the high-water mark to the extreme low-water
21 mark and that the shellfish conservation ordinances apply only within the intertidal zones
22 of municipalities.
