An Act Regarding the Brunswick Naval Air Station Job Increment Financing Fund

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §13083-H, sub-§10 is enacted to read:
- 10. Remote employee. "Remote employee" means an employee who performs employment duties outside of a traditional office environment, including from the employee's home or other location that is not on the premises of the employer.
- **Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §13083-S-1, sub-§3,** ¶E, as enacted by PL 2009, c. 641, §9, is amended to read:
 - E. Payments made to the fund must be allocated as follows:
 - (1) For payments transferred to the fund in 2011 and 2012, 100% must be allocated to the college;
 - (2) For payments made to the fund in 2013, 75% must be allocated to the college and 25% must be allocated to the authority; and
 - (3) For payments made to the fund in 2014 and after, 50% must be allocated to the college and 50% must be allocated to the authority-; and
 - (4) For payments made to the fund in 2026 and after, 25% must be allocated to the college and 75% must be allocated to the authority.
- **Sec. 3. 5 MRSA §13083-S-1, sub-§3, ¶F,** as enacted by PL 2009, c. 641, §9, is amended to read:
 - F. Payments to the fund are not allowed for calendar years beginning on or after January 1, 2031 2051. If at least 5,000 8,000 net new jobs are created in the base area prior to 2031 2051, the services funded under paragraphs A and B must be reviewed by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over economic development matters in order to determine whether continuance of the fund is necessary.
- **Sec. 4. 5 MRSA §13083-S-1, sub-§4,** as amended by PL 2019, c. 659, Pt. E, §1, is further amended to read:
- **4.** Certification by authority. By February 15th of each year, beginning in 2011, the authority shall provide a report identifying each employer located at the base area to the commissioner. By April 15th of each year, beginning in 2021, each employer located at the base area shall report to the commissioner the number of employees employed at the base area, including remote employees, during the immediately preceding calendar year, the state income taxes withheld for each of those employees and any further information the commissioner may reasonably require.
- The commissioner shall certify annually to the assessor on or before June 1st of each year the following information:
 - A. Employment, payroll and state withholding data necessary to calculate the base level of employment;
 - B. The total number of employees added during the previous year within the base area above the base level of employment, including additional associated payroll and withholding data necessary to calculate the job tax increment and establish the appropriate payment to the fund;

- C. A listing of all employers within the base area that pay withholding taxes, the locations of those employers and the number of employees at each location;
 - D. A listing of all affiliated businesses, data regarding current employment, payroll and Maine income tax withholding for each affiliated business within the base area; and
 - E. Any information required by the assessor to determine the job tax increment pursuant to this section and the employment tax increment revenues pursuant to Title 36, chapter 917.
 - **Sec. 5. 5 MRSA §13083-S-1, sub-§5,** as amended by PL 2023, c. 613, Pt. C, §3, is further amended to read:
 - 5. Procedure for payment of revenue to the fund. On or before July 15th of each year, the assessor shall review the information required by subsection 4 and calculate the job tax increment for the preceding calendar year. The assessor shall also calculate the amount of the benefit base in the base area eligible for reimbursement to qualified Maine Employment Tax Increment Financing Program businesses pursuant to Title 36, chapter 917. Between July 1st and July 15th of each year, the assessor shall certify to the State Controller the total remaining job tax increment as a result of the limitation in subsection 3, paragraph D and the remaining benefit base after reimbursements have been made to qualified Maine Employment Tax Increment Financing Program businesses pursuant to Title 36, chapter 917. On or before July 31st of each year, the State Controller shall transfer 50% 100% of the remaining job tax increment and 50% 100% of the remaining benefit base to the state job tax increment contingent account established, maintained and administered by the State Controller from General Fund undedicated revenue within the withholding tax category. On or before July 31st of each year, the State Controller shall deposit this revenue into the fund and distribute the payments pursuant to subsection 3.

Sec. 6. 5 MRSA §13083-S-2 is enacted to read:

§13083-S-2. Authority roads are public ways

- 1. **Definitions.** As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
 - A. "Private way" has the same meaning as in Title 23, section 1903, subsection 10-A.
 - B. "Public way" has the same meaning as in Title 23, section 1903, subsection 11.
- **2. Public ways.** A road or street under the jurisdiction of the authority that is not a private way is a public way.

34 SUMMARY

This bill includes remote workers of businesses in the Midcoast Regional Redevelopment Authority, which owns and administers the former Brunswick Naval Air Station, in the definition of "employee" for purposes of calculating disbursements by the State into the Brunswick Naval Air Station Job Increment Financing Fund. The bill amends disbursements into the fund by removing the state 50% share of the remaining tax increment share and base benefit share so that 100% goes into the fund. The bill changes the allocation of reimbursement from the fund from 50% to the Midcoast Regional Redevelopment Authority and 50% to the Southern Maine Community College in the

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- Maine Community College System to 75% to the authority and 25% to the college. The bill also clarifies that streets and roads under the jurisdiction of the Midcoast Regional Development Authority that are not private ways are public ways. 2
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
