7 Initiative: Provides funding for 2 State Police Detective positions and one Forensic

SUMMARY

23 This bill repeals the requirement that the Commissioner of Public Safety and the
24 Attorney General pursue federal funding to establish a cold case homicide unit. The bill
25 also repeals the provision of law that makes establishment of a cold case homicide unit
26 contingent upon availability of federal funding. The provision of law directing the
27 Attorney General in collaboration with the Commissioner of Public Safety to establish a
28 cold case homicide unit is not repealed. The bill provides funding for the fiscal year
29 2016-17.
