An Act to Change the Residency Requirements for State Funding for Student Tuition at the Maine School of Science and Mathematics

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §8202, sub-§2, ¶A, as amended by PL 1995, c. 665, Pt. FF, §1, is further amended to read:

A. The amount must be paid in 4 equal quarterly payments during the year of attendance. The first payment must be made by July 31st. The amount of tuition and other costs paid for all students is limited to the amount appropriated for this purpose. To be eligible for state funding under this paragraph, a student must have resided in Maine with a the parent, other relative or guardian for at least 6 months immediately preceding application to the school of the student seeking state funding must be a resident of the State at the start of the school year for which tuition is to be paid.

11 SUMMARY

This bill changes the residency requirement for a student to receive free tuition at the Maine School of Science and Mathematics from the student being required to have resided in the State with a parent, other relative or guardian for a period of at least 6 months to the student's parent or guardian being required to be a resident of the State at the start of the school year for which tuition is to be paid.
