1 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 3 Whereas, additional funding to the University of Maine System is necessary for the beginning of fiscal year 2025-26, which will begin before the 90-day period expires; and 4 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within 5 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 6 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 7 8 therefore, 9 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 10 Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §10901, sub-§1-A is enacted to read: 11 **1-A. Peer institution.** "Peer institution" means a postsecondary education institution that is used for comparative analysis and benchmarking of institutional qualities as 12 13 determined by the trustees for each campus of the university. 14 Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §10912 is enacted to read: 15 §10912. Campus funding levels; hourly employee minimum wage 1. Fiscal year 2026-27 funding level. Beginning July 1, 2026, for the 2026-27 fiscal 16 year, each campus of the university must be funded at no less than 95% of the funding that 17 18 the campus's peer institution receives from the peer institution's state on a per student basis. The university, in calculating the peer institution's funding, shall use the most recent data 19 20 available. 21 2. Fiscal year 2027-28 funding level. Beginning July 1, 2027, for the 2027-28 fiscal year, each campus of the university must be funded at no less than 100% of the funding 22 that the campus's peer institution receives from the peer institution's state on a per student 23 basis. The university, in calculating the peer institution's funding, shall use the most recent 24 25 data available. 26 3. Minimum wage to hourly employees. Beginning July 1, 2025, the minimum hourly 27 wage at the university is equal to 125% of the minimum hourly wage established in Title 28 26, section 664, subsection 1. 29 Sec. 3. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and 30 allocations are made. 31 UNIVERSITY OF MAINE SYSTEM, BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE 32 **Educational and General Activities - UMS 0031** 33 Initiative: Provides ongoing funds to support a 6% increase in funding for fiscal year 2025-26 and an additional 4% increase in funding for fiscal year 2026-27 to support the 34 continuation of current University of Maine System operations. 35

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.

3 SUMMARY

This bill requires that, beginning July 1, 2026, each campus of the University of Maine System be funded at no less than 95% of the funding that the campus's peer institution receives on a per student basis. Beginning July 1, 2027, each campus of the University of Maine System must be funded at no less than 100% of the funding that the campus's peer institution receives on a per student basis. For the purposes of these provisions, the bill provides that peer institutions are determined by the trustees for each campus of the University of Maine System. The bill also requires that, beginning July 1, 2025, the minimum hourly wage at the University of Maine System be equal to 125% of the State's minimum hourly wage. The bill also provides ongoing funds to support a 6% increase in funding for fiscal year 2025-26 and an additional 4% increase in funding for fiscal year 2026-27 to support the continuation of current University of Maine System operations.
