4 5	MAINE HEALTH CARE EDUCATION TRAINING AND MEDICAL RESIDENCY FUND		
6	§1700-F. Maine Health Care Education Training and Medical Residency Fund		
7 8	1. <b>Definitions.</b> As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.		
9 10	A. "Earn as you learn program" means a program in which a student or learner is employed and is paid for learning specific skills and expertise for a particular role.		
11 12 13 14	B. "Rural" means, with regard to areas in the State, the areas that are designated as health professional shortage areas or medically underserved areas or that contain a medically underserved population as defined by the federal Department of Health and Human Services, Health Resources and Services Administration.		
15 16 17 18	2. Fund established. The Maine Health Care Education Training and Medical Residency Fund, referred to in this chapter as "the fund," is established within the department as a dedicated, nonlapsing account to support health care in rural and underserved communities and physician workforce development.		
19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26	3. Fund sources and administration. The fund consists of appropriations, allocations and contributions from public and private sources. The department may apply for federal and private grant funding for the purposes of this section. Money received by the department on behalf of the fund must be used for the purposes of this section. The fund must be maintained and administered by the department. Any unexpended balance in the fund carries forward for continued use under this section, except for federal funds that must be expended according to guidelines issued by the Federal Government governing the use of those funds.		
27 28	<b>4.</b> Use of fund. The department shall make distributions from the fund to programs based in the State to support the following purposes:		
29 30	A. Expanding rural primary care clinical rotations for 3rd-year medical students to support long-term professional health care practice in the rural parts of the State;		
31 32	B. Expanding rural primary care clinical rotations for 4th-year medical students to support long-term professional health care practice in the rural parts of the State;		
33	C. Expanding rural residency positions and rotations for medical students in the State		
34 35 36 37	D. Establishing and expanding clinical preceptorships in rural and underserved communities, including the costs of preceptor recruiting, training and compensation for preceptor time and the costs of travel and housing for medical students in rural rotations;		
38 39	E. Supporting programs that seek to develop local health care education leaders for the purpose of expanding clinical rotations, residencies and preceptorships;

Providing competitive grants through a program designed by the department for innovative solutions, technological advancements and earn as you learn programs to support and expand clinical education, training and placements for clinical health care roles. The department shall consult with experts in the field of health care in designing the grant program; and			
6	G. Supporting electronic platforms used to make clinical health care placements.			
7 8 9	5. Rules. The department may adopt rules to implement this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
