2	Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §7102, sub-§1-C is enacted to read:
3 4	1-C. Communications service. "Communications service" has the same meaning as in section 9202, subsection 3.
5	Sec. 2. 35-A MRSA §7110 is enacted to read:
6	§7110. Rate increases
7 8 9 10	A provider of communications service in the State shall notify all affected customers of a rate increase, including identifying the reason for the rate increase, within a reasonable time prior to the rate increase. The commission shall adopt routine technical rules, as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A, to carry out the purposes of this section.

12 13 14 15	This bill requires providers of communications services, including any wireline voice, satellite, data, fixed wireless data or video retail service, to notify affected customers of a rate increase and the reason for the rate increase, within a reasonable time prior to the rate increase.
