An Act to Provide Protection from Unfair Parking Tickets on Lots Accessible to the Public

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 10 MRSA c. 239 is enacted to read:
3	<u>CHAPTER 239</u>
4 5	ENFORCEMENT OF PARKING VIOLATIONS ON LOTS ACCESSIBLE TO <u>THE PUBLIC</u>
6	<u>§1500-Z. Enforcement of parking violations on property accessible by public</u>
7 8 9 10	A person or entity that administers the collection of money for the privilege of parking a motor vehicle on property accessible by the general public and assesses fees on the owner of a motor vehicle parked in violation of the parking rules on the property is subject to the provisions of this section.
11 12 13 14	1. Notice of violation. The person or entity shall provide notice of violation to the owner of a motor vehicle parked on the property in violation of the rules at the time of violation. A parking violation fee may not be assessed if a notice of violation is not provided at the time of the violation.
15 16 17 18	2. Notice to credit reporting agencies prohibited. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, failure by an owner of a motor vehicle to pay fees assessed for a violation of the parking rules for the property may not be reported to a credit reporting agency.
19	3. Enforcement. The Attorney General shall enforce this section.
20 21 22 23	<u>4. Private cause of action.</u> A person harmed by a violation of this section may bring an action in court against the person or entity in violation of this section, except that a person may not bring such an action without first filing a request for mediation with the Office of the Attorney General.
24 25	5. Violation. A person or entity that violates this section is subject to treble damages and a penalty not to exceed \$5,000 per occurrence.
26	SUMMARY
27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34	This bill requires that a notice of parking violation on property accessible by the general public must be provided at the time of the violation. Under the bill, failure by the owner of a motor vehicle to pay fees assessed for a parking violation on the property may not be reported to a credit reporting agency. The Attorney General is charged with enforcing these provisions, and a person harmed by a violation may bring an action in court against the person or entity in violation as long as the person has first filed a request for mediation with the Office of the Attorney General. A person or entity that violates these provisions is subject to treble damages and a penalty not to exceed \$5,000 per occurrence.
