Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'An Act to Amend the Laws Governing the Advisory Committee on the Fund to Address PFAS Contamination'

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting the following:

'Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §12004-I, sub-§2-I, as enacted by PL 2021, c. 635, Pt. XX, §1, is amended to read:

Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §320-L, first ¶, as enacted by PL 2021, c. 635, Pt. XX, §2, is amended to read:

The Advisory Committee on the Fund To Address PFAS Contamination is established pursuant to Title 5, section 12004-I, subsection 2-I to make recommendations to the department regarding administration of the fund ~~and to report to the Legislature~~. In order to develop recommendations for the department, the advisory committee may form working groups that include and seek input from subject matter experts from the public and private sectors to deliberate issues relating to the purposes of the fund as described in section 320-K, subsection 4, including, but not limited to, health monitoring, short-term

1 financial aid for farmers, research priorities, solar siting, long-term environmental
2 monitoring and land acquisition.

3 **Sec. 3. 7 MRSA §320-L, sub-§1**, as enacted by PL 2021, c. 635, Pt. XX, §2, is
4 amended by amending the first blocked paragraph to read:

5 The 7 members of the public appointed by the commissioner serve on the advisory
6 committee for terms of 3 years. Members may be appointed for consecutive terms.
7 Members who are Legislators are appointed for the duration of the legislative terms of
8 office for which they were appointed, except that at the end of the term, members who are
9 Legislators continue to serve until a successor is appointed.

10 **Sec. 4. 7 MRSA §320-L, sub-§3**, as enacted by PL 2021, c. 635, Pt. XX, §2, is
11 amended to read:

12 **3. Reports Proceedings of the advisory committee.** The advisory committee shall
13 hold at least 2 public hearings annually to seek input from the public on efforts to meet the
14 purposes of the fund. All proceedings of the advisory committee are public proceedings
15 within the meaning of Title 1, chapter 13, subchapter 1. Notwithstanding Title 1, section
16 403, subsection 6, all records of proceedings of the advisory committee are public and
17 subject to the requirements of Title 1, section 403, subsection 2. ~~The advisory committee~~
18 ~~shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over~~
19 ~~agricultural matters and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction~~
20 ~~over environmental matters annually, beginning March 1, 2023, on the input from subject~~
21 ~~matter experts under subsection 1 and members of the public on issues relating to the~~

38 **SUMMARY**

39 This amendment, which replaces the bill, provides legislative per diem for public
40 members of the Advisory Committee on the Fund To Address PFAS Contamination. The
41 amendment provides that members who are Legislators continue to serve until a successor

1 is appointed. The amendment also removes the requirement that the advisory committee
2 report annually to the joint standing committees of the Legislature having jurisdiction over
3 agricultural matters and environmental matters on activities of the advisory committee and
4 issues relating to the purposes and the use of the Fund To Address PFAS Contamination.
