34 35 36 37 38	This amendment changes the term "safe haven baby box" to "newborn safety device," requires a facility with a newborn safety device to test the alarm equipped to the device at least one time per week and visually inspect the alarm at least 2 times per day to ensure that the alarm is properly functioning and to locate a newborn safety device in a conspicuous area visible to employees of the facility and allows the facility to be
