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1 2 3	The Working Waterfront Advisory Council, established by section 12004-I, subsection 57-I and referred to in this section as "the council," is established to address issues facing the State's working waterfronts.
4 5 6 7 8 9	1. Membership. The director shall appoint up to 15 members to the council who, to the greatest extent possible, must represent federally recognized Indian nations, tribes or bands in the State, municipalities, nonprofit organizations, trade organizations, educational institutions, individuals and industries that represent or use working waterfronts in the State. To the greatest extent possible, the membership of the council must reflect a geographic distribution along the coast.
10 11 12 13 14	In making appointments, the director shall consider and appoint residents of the State who have knowledge of problems facing working waterfronts in the State, have experience in advocacy relating to working waterfront issues or provide leadership in programs or activities that create and improve opportunities or spread awareness related to working waterfronts and persons that use them.
15 16 17	2. Term. A member's term is for 3 years. If a member is unable to complete the term, the director shall appoint a member pursuant to subsection 1 to serve out the unexpired portion of the term.
