The department shall review the New York Medicaid program that provides up to \$2,000 annually per individual for nonmedical transportation costs for services in an individual's plan of care as well as any other similar or relevant methods of financing such services. The department shall assess options for modifying or amending home and community-based waiver programs, in particular the waiver programs provided under Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Section 19, to provide nonmedical transportation services to recipients of current services. The department shall meet with relevant stakeholders as necessary to assess programs in other states and develop programs for use in this State, including pilot projects. The department shall submit a report with its findings, including recommendations for at least one potential pilot project, to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters no later than February 28, 2021. The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters may report out legislation based on the report to the First Regular Session of the 130th Legislature.'

35 36	This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, replaces the resolve and removes the emergency preamble and clause. It requires the Department of Health and

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Human Services to review nonmedical transportation programs in other states that provide 1 services under Medicaid to older adults with disabilities and other adults with disabilities, 2 brain injury or other related conditions to determine options for providing nonmedical 3 transportation services in this State. The department is required to review the New York 4 Medicaid program and any other relevant programs, determine options for modifying or 5 amending home and community-based waiver programs, and develop possible programs, 6 including pilot projects, for use in this State. The department is required to submit a report 7 to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and 8 human services matters no later than February 28, 2021, and the committee is authorized 9 to report out legislation to the First Regular Session of the 130th Legislature. 10 **FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED** 11
