In Part A, the amendment requires law enforcement agencies to select, assign and train civil rights officers and to keep the Attorney General informed of the identity of the civil rights officer. The amendment requires law enforcement agencies to make contact information for their civil rights officers publicly available. In Part B, the amendment prohibits profiling by a law enforcement officer or agency based on sexual orientation, gender identity, ethnicity, religion, socioeconomic status, ancestry, national origin, race, gender, color or physical or mental disability and provides that profiling includes targeting an individual based on any of these factors. In Part C, the amendment appropriates \$398,182 in fiscal year 2022-23 for the Department of Public Safety for 2 Planning and Research Associate II positions and to fund computer programming and maintenance costs.
