1 Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of 2 8 members appointed as follows:

Two members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, including
 members from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature;

- 5 2. Three members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the 6 House, including 2 members from the party holding the largest number of seats in the 7 Legislature and one member from the party holding the 2nd-largest number of seats in the 8 Legislature;
- 9 3. One member representing an organization representing tenants receiving housing 10 assistance under the federal housing choice voucher program, appointed by the President 11 of the Senate;
- 4. One member representing an organization representing landlords, appointed by the
 Speaker of the House; and
- 14 5. One member representing housing authorities in the State, appointed by the 15 President of the Senate.
- 16 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member is the Senate chair 17 and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the 18 commission.
- 19 Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this 20 resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative 21 Council once all appointments have been completed. After appointment of all members, 22 the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission. If 30 days or more 23 after the effective date of this resolve a majority of but not all appointments have been 24 25 made, the chairs may request authority and the Legislative Council may grant authority for the commission to meet and conduct its business. 26
- Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study discrimination against
 tenants who participate in federal, state and local tenant-based rental assistance programs.
 The commission, in conducting its study, shall meet with and interview stakeholders.
- Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Legislative Council shall provide
 necessary staffing services to the commission, except that Legislative Council staff support
 is not authorized when the Legislature is in regular or special session.
- Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 1, 2021, the commission
 shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested
 legislation, for presentation to the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary. The joint
