2 3	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1726, sub-§2, ¶E, as enacted by PL 2015, c. 203, §2, is amended to read:
4 5 6 7	E. Two persons appointed by the member of the House of Representatives who is the leader of the minority party in the House. One person must be a spiritual counselor with experience working with persons with serious illnesses and their family members. One person must represent persons 55 years of age and older; and

10 11	F. The executive director of the Maine Hospice Council, established in section 8611, who serves as a nonvoting member-; and
