1	Sec. 1. State Auditor to compile a report that ranks all nonprofit
2	corporations in the State that have received state funds. Resolved: That the State
3	Auditor shall compile a report that ranks all nonprofit corporations in the State that have
4 5	received state funds. The report must be completed using existing resources of the Office of the State Auditor. In compiling the report, the State Auditor shall:
6	A. Analyze the past 20 years of state funding to nonprofit corporations in the State;
7	B. Rank per 5-year period the nonprofit corporations in the State from the nonprofit
8	corporation receiving the most state funds to the nonprofit corporation receiving the
9	least state funds; and
10 11	C. State the percentage per state budget that was disbursed to nonprofit corporations in the State over the past 20 years.
12 13 14	Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 6, 2023, the State Auditor shall submit the report under section 1 to the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs.
15	SUMMARY
16 17 18 19 20	This resolve directs the State Auditor to compile a report by December 6, 2023 of state funds received by nonprofit corporations in the State for the past 20 years, break down the report into 5-year increments, rank the nonprofits from the most state funds received to the least state funds received and state the percentage of the state budget that was disbursed to nonprofit corporations in the State.
