A person who refuses to leave a recovery residence after a discharge or transfer that is consistent with the requirements of this section may be ordered to leave the premises by the recovery residence owner or operator or by a law enforcement officer.' The amendment specifies that the discharge and transfer policy must be approved by a credentialing entity that is recognized by the department. The amendment also clarifies that a person who refuses to leave a recovery residence after a discharge or
