An Act to Create a Restricted Senior Lobster and Crab Fishing License

The holder of a Class I, Class II, Class III, <u>restricted senior</u> , apprentice or student lobster and crab fishing license may fish for, take, possess, ship or transport within the State lobsters or crabs and sell lobsters or crabs the license holder has taken. The license does not authorize the license holder to remove lobster meat from the shell or to take, possess, transport or ship lobster parts or meat. The holder of a Class II or Class III license is liable for the licensed activities under this subsection of all unlicensed crew members assisting that licensee.

14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26	C-1. A restricted senior lobster and crab fishing license authorizes the license holder to engage in the licensed activities under subsection 2. A restricted senior lobster and crab fishing license may be issued only to a person who, at the time of issuance, is 70 years of age or older and has previously held a Class I, Class II or Class III license for a period of at least 5 consecutive years. A person issued a restricted senior lobster and crab fishing license may not submerge more than 100 lobster traps at any one time in the coastal waters of the State. At the time a restricted senior lobster and crab fishing license is issued or renewed, the applicant or license holder shall declare the vessel that will be used to conduct lobster and crab fishing activities under that license. The license holder's trap tags are allocated to that vessel, pursuant to the license. The department is not authorized to issue more than 100 restricted senior trap tags to the declared vessel, regardless of the number of restricted senior license holders fishing from that vessel.

9	SUMMARY
10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21	This bill establishes a restricted senior lobster and crab fishing license. A restricted senior lobster and crab fishing license can be issued only to a person 70 years of age or older who has previously held a Class I, Class II or Class III license for at least 5 consecutive years. A restricted senior lobster and crab fishing licensee may not submerge at any one time more than 100 lobster traps and the applicant for the license or the license holder must declare the vessel that will be used for lobster and crab fishing at the time of issuance or renewal. The license holder's trap tags are allocated to that vessel and the Department of Marine Resources is not authorized to issue more than 100 restricted senior lobster and crab fishing license holders fishing from that vessel. The bill also assigns a license fee and license surcharge of \$126 and \$20 respectively for a restricted senior lobster and crab fishing license.
