## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §666-A is enacted to read:

## §666-A. Special wage certificates for individuals with chronic unemployment

- 1. Chronically unemployed; definition. As used in this section, "chronically unemployed," with respect to an individual, means that the individual has been unemployed for at least 24 months and is available for full-time employment.
- 2. Director may issue special certificate to chronically unemployed individual. Beginning January 1, 2024, the director may issue a special certificate to a chronically unemployed individual authorizing the individual to negotiate with prospective employers terms and conditions of employment, including compensation less than the minimum wage, in accordance with subsection 3.
- 3. Validity of certificate; employer to pay minimum wage. A certificate issued under subsection 2 is valid only for the duration of time equal to that of the individual's previous unemployment prior to the individual's beginning employment with an employer under subsection 2. After that time period, if the terms and conditions include compensation less than the minimum wage, the employer shall pay the individual at least the minimum wage as described in section 664.
- 4. Employee receiving public assistance to maintain eligibility for 12 months. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, an individual who has been issued a certificate under subsection 2 may not have that individual's public assistance benefits reduced or discontinued due to the individual's income for at least 12 months following the individual's employment by an employer pursuant to this section.

23 SUMMARY

This bill allows the Director of Labor Standards within the Department of Labor to issue a special certificate to a chronically unemployed individual authorizing the individual to negotiate with prospective employers terms and conditions of employment, including compensation less than the minimum wage, for the duration of time equal to that of the individual's previous unemployment prior to the individual's beginning employment with an employer.
