21 SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill, which is a concept draft, and includes the following provisions.

- 1. It requires the Department of Corrections to enter into a contract with a service provider independent of the department to conduct individualized needs assessments of juveniles in the custody of the department, including any juveniles placed on community reintegration status.
- 2. It provides ongoing General Fund funding of \$4,000,000 beginning in fiscal year 2022-23 to the Department of Education to establish or expand school-based restorative justice programs, mentoring services for juveniles involved in the juvenile legal system and, in collaboration with the Department of Labor, workforce development, educational and vocational programs for juveniles involved in the juvenile legal system.
- 3. It provides one-time General Fund funding of \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2022-23 to the Office of Policy Innovation and the Future to establish a pilot program to be administered by an independent, nonprofit community-based organization or collaborative of organizations to distribute funding provided by the office to small community-based organizations and similar entities to establish or support community-based services for juveniles.
- 4. It provides ongoing General Fund funding of \$3,000,000 beginning in fiscal year 2022-23 to the Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Child and Family Services to establish or expand services for juvenile victims of gender-based violence and trafficking, restorative justice services provided under juvenile behavioral health programs

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and runaway youth programs, substance use disorder and medically managed treatment
services for juveniles and peer-based support services for juveniles involved in the juvenile
legal system.

5. It provides ongoing General Fund funding of \$4,000,000 beginning in fiscal year 2022-23 to the Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Child and Family Services to establish or expand, in collaboration with the Maine State Housing Authority, transitional housing services for juveniles, emergency or crisis housing services for juveniles and other supportive housing-related services for juveniles.
