11	Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:
12 13	'An Act To Ensure Continued Health-related Services for Children To Access Education'
14	Amend the bill by striking out the emergency preamble and inserting the following:
15 16	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
17 18 19	Whereas, health-related services provided to children to access education are critical to their success and must be available to the maximum extent possible under federal law; and
20 21 22 23	Whereas, the Legislature has an important role in ensuring that rules adopted by the Department of Health and Human Services result in health-related services being provided to children to access their education by providing additional review, and the review must be in place as soon as possible; and
24 25 26 27	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'
28 29	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the emergency clause and inserting the following:
30	'Sec. 1. 34-B MRSA §1227 is enacted to read:
31 32	<u>§1227. Health-related services for children from birth to 5 years of age to access</u> <u>education</u>
33 34	1. Services required. The department shall provide reimbursement for health-related services that are required for children from birth to 5 years of age to access their education.

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Health-related services may include, but are not limited to, physical therapy, occupational
 therapy, speech therapy, nursing services, social work services and behavioral health
 services.

2. Rulemaking. The department shall adopt rules to implement this section. The rules
 must establish the process for reimbursement under subsection 1 and be consistent with
 federal law. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules pursuant
 to Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

8 Sec. 2. Initial rulemaking. The Department of Health and Human Services shall
9 adopt a new rule to implement the requirements of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 34-B,
10 section 1227 in accordance with this section.

1. Major substantive rule. Notwithstanding Title 34-B, section 1227, subsection 2, rules adopted under this section are major substantive rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A and must be provisionally adopted and submitted to the Legislature for review no later than January 13, 2023. After adoption of rules under this section, any rules subsequently adopted by the Department of Health and Human Services to implement the requirements of Title 34-B, section 1227 are routine technical rules as specified in section 1227.

18 2. Stakeholder groups. The Department of Health and Human Services shall convene stakeholder groups as necessary to discuss the proposed new major substantive rule under 19 subsection 1 prior to any rule-making activity initiated pursuant to Title 5, chapter 375, 20 subchapter 2-A. Stakeholder groups must include representatives of providers, advocates, 21 parents of children receiving services, the Child Development Services System under Title 22 20-A, section 7209, school administrative units and the Department of Education. The 23 24 Department of Health and Human Services shall also take into account the findings from the independent review of the State's early childhood special education services being 25 carried out pursuant to Public Law 2019, chapter 343, Part VVVV.' 26

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or sectionnumber to read consecutively.

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SUMMARY

30 This amendment replaces the bill. It clarifies that the services provided to children 31 from birth to 5 years of age are health-related rather than school-related and are necessary to access education and removes the reference to developmental preschools. It requires the 32 33 Department of Health and Human Services to adopt a new rule to implement the 34 reimbursement of health-related services and specifies that the initial rule is major 35 substantive and the subsequent rules are routine technical. The major substantive rule must 36 be provisionally adopted and submitted to the Legislature for review no later than January 37 13, 2023. It requires stakeholder groups to be convened as necessary and prior to rule-38 making activity.
