An Act To Create a Municipal Grant Program To Promote Sustainable Economic Development

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §13073-C is enacted to read:

§13073-C. Municipal Grant Fund

 The Municipal Grant Fund is established as a nonlapsing fund within the Office of Community Development. The Director of the Office of Community Development shall administer the Municipal Grant Fund, referred to in this section as "the fund."

- 1. Fund purpose. The purpose of the fund is to provide funding for municipalities for projects that further the goals of sustainable economic development as outlined by the Maine Economic Growth Council, established in Title 10, section 929-A and referred to in this section as "the council," in the council's annual "Measures of Growth" report, or successor report, and by the economic development strategy for the State as administered by the department.
- **2. Application process.** The department shall adopt rules establishing an application process for municipalities for fund grants for the purposes set forth in this section.
- 3. Competitive procedure. Funds must be dispersed in accordance with a competitive, quality-based selection procedure as established and administered by the department.
- 4. Preference in awards. In awarding grants, the department shall give preference to those projects that further the goals of the council as outlined in the council's "Measures of Growth" report, or successor report, as well as goals related to the economic development strategy for the State as administered by the department.
- 5. Maximum award. A grantee may not be awarded a total amount in excess of \$50,000 in a legislative biennium.
- **6. Rules.** The department shall adopt rules necessary to carry out this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
- **Sec. 2. 30-A MRSA §5681, sub-§5-C,** as amended by PL 2013, c. 368, Pt. J, §1, is further amended to read:
- **5-C.** Transfers to General Fund and Municipal Grant Fund. For the months beginning on or after July 1, 2009, \$25,383,491 in fiscal year 2009-10, \$38,145,323 in fiscal year 2010-11, \$40,350,638 in fiscal year 2011-12, \$44,267,343 in fiscal year 2012-13, \$73,306,246 in fiscal year 2013-14 and \$85,949,391 in fiscal year 2014-15 from the total transfers pursuant to subsection 5 must be transferred to General Fund undedicated revenue. For the months beginning on or after October 1, 2021, \$250,000 in fiscal year 2021-22 from the total transfers pursuant to subsection 5 must be transferred to the Municipal Grant Fund established under Title 5, section 13073-C. The amounts transferred to General Fund undedicated revenue or the Municipal Grant Fund each fiscal year pursuant to this subsection must be deducted from the distributions required by subsections 4-A and 4-B based on the percentage share of the transfers to the Local Government Fund pursuant to subsection 5. The reductions in this subsection must be allocated to each month proportionately based on the budgeted monthly transfers to the Local Government Fund as determined at the beginning of the fiscal year.

This bill establishes a fund to provide competitive grants funding for cities and towns
for projects that further the goals of sustainable economic development as outlined by the
Maine Economic Growth Council in the council's annual "Measures of Growth" report and
by the economic development strategy for the State as administered by the Department of
Economic and Community Development. The bill provides for the transfer of \$250,000 in
fiscal year 2021-22 from state-municipal revenue sharing to support the fund.
