An Act to Increase the Membership of the State Board of Education and Review the Board's Responsibilities, Functions and Staffing

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- **Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §401, sub-§1,** as amended by PL 2013, c. 15, §1, is further amended to read:
- 1. Appointment. The state board consists of 9 10 members, including one member pursuant to subsection 1-D, and, beginning in the 2007-2008 school year, 2 nonvoting student members, one junior and one senior in high school. All Except for the member pursuant to subsection 1-D, all members are appointed by the Governor. Four members must reside in the State's First Congressional District at the time of appointment, 4 members must reside in the State's Second Congressional District at the time of appointment and one member may reside in either the First Congressional District or the Second Congressional District at the time of appointment. One of the student members must attend school in the State's First Congressional District at the time of appointment and the other student member must attend school in the State's Second Congressional District at the time of appointment. Each appointment is subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education matters and to confirmation by the Senate.

Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §401, sub-§1-D is enacted to read:

- 1-D. Maine Teacher of the Year member. One member of the state board must be a current or former recipient of the department's Maine Teacher of the Year award who is nominated and appointed by the state board to serve, notwithstanding subsection 4, a 3-year term.
- **Sec. 3. Working group to review State Board of Education.** The Department of Education shall establish a working group of stakeholders and other interested parties to review the responsibilities, functions and staffing of the State Board of Education, as established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 12004-C, subsection 1. The department shall report to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs on the findings of the working group by January 15, 2024.

27 SUMMARY

This bill adds one member to the State Board of Education, who must be a current or former recipient of the Department of Education's Maine Teacher of the Year award who is nominated and appointed by the state board and serves for a 3-year term.

It directs the Department of Education to establish a working group of stakeholders and other interested parties to review the responsibilities, functions and staffing of the State Board of Education. The department is directed to report to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs on the findings of the working group by January 15, 2024.
