4 5	D. The candidate submits written certification from the Maine Criminal Justice Academy that the candidate has:
6 7	(1) Met the basic law enforcement training standards under Title 25, section 2804 -C; Θr
8 9	(2) Met the basic corrections training standards under Title 25, section 2804-D; and
10 11	(3) On an annual basis, met the in-service law enforcement training standards under Title 25, section 2804-E; and
12 13 14	(4) On an annual basis, met any other statutory requirement of preservice, basic or in-service law enforcement training required for certification or continued certification as a law enforcement officer; and

Any person who <u>served as a full-time law enforcement officer</u> employed by a state agency, including the University of Maine System, on or before July <u>1, 1990 or</u> is serving in the office of sheriff on June 26, 1997 <u>2021</u> or who served prior to that date is deemed to meet the minimum qualifications of subsection 3.

22 23 24 25 26 27	This bill requires a candidate for sheriff or someone serving as sheriff to have met and continue to meet any statutory requirements of preservice, basic or in-service law enforcement training required for certification or continued certification as a law enforcement officer. This bill also provides that any person who served as a full-time law enforcement officer employed by a state agency, including the University of Maine System, on or before July 1, 1990 is considered to have met the standards required by this bill.
