COMMITTEE AMENDMENT “ ” to H.P. 825, L.D. 1147, “Resolve, To Enhance Access to Medication Management for Individuals with Serious and Persistent Mental Illness”

Amend the resolve by striking out all of the 3rd paragraph after the title (page 1, lines 7 to 10 in L.D.).

Amend the resolve by striking out everything after the emergency preamble and before the emergency clause and inserting the following:

**‘Sec. 1. Department of Health and Human Services to increase MaineCare reimbursement for adults with serious mental illness. Resolved:** That, no later than July 1, 2021, the Department of Health and Human Services shall amend its rule Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapters II and III, Section 65, Behavioral Health Services, to increase reimbursement rates for medication management services in place on January 1, 2019 by 25%. The department shall amend the rules to provide for adjustment of the reimbursement rates every 5 years by an inflation adjustment cost-of-living percentage change for the previous 5 years in accordance with the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer Price Index. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

**Sec. 2. Appropriations and allocations. Resolved:** That the following appropriations and allocations are made.

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**SUMMARY**

This amendment removes from the resolve the requirement to develop with stakeholder input a per member, per month rate and a 3-tiered rate for medication management. It specifies that the 25% increase on medication management is on the rates in place on January 1, 2019 to reflect that the reimbursement rates for some providers of medication management were increased pursuant to Public Law 2019, chapter 616, but that increase was less than 25%. It requires the Department of Health and Human Services to apply a cost-of-living increase to adjust reimbursement rates every 5 years. It also replaces the appropriations and allocations section.
