7 8	§12941. Educational Opportunity Grant Program for Family Members of Deceased Veterans, First Responders and Health Care Workers
9 10	1. Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
11	A. "Authority" means the Finance Authority of Maine.
12 13	B. "First responder" has the same meaning as in Title 22, section 832-A, subsection 1 paragraph E.
14 15 16	C. "Fund" means the Educational Opportunity Grant Program for Family Members of Deceased Veterans, First Responders and Health Care Workers Fund under section 12942.
17 18	D. "Program" means the Educational Opportunity Grant Program for Family Members of Deceased Veterans, First Responders and Health Care Workers under subsection 2.
19 20	E. "Public postsecondary educational institution" means the University of Maine System, the Maine Community College System or the Maine Maritime Academy.

The Educational Opportunity Grant Program for Family Members of Deceased Veterans, First Responders and Health Care Workers is established within and administered by the authority. The program provides a grant to an eligible person to cover the cost of tuition, room and board, books and other required educational materials and other fees and expenses related to attending a public postsecondary educational institution typically paid for by financial aid.
27	3. Eligibility. A person is eligible to receive a grant under the program if:
28 29 30 31	A. The person is a child or spouse of a veteran, first responder or health care worker who during the course of employment as a military service member, first responder or health care worker dies or contracts an illness or condition that leads to the death of the veteran, first responder or health care worker;
32 33 34 35	B. The person or the deceased veteran, first responder or health care worker under paragraph A is a resident of the State at the time of the death or contraction of the illness or condition leading to the death of the veteran, first responder or health care worker; and
36 37	C. The person is accepted to a course of study in a public postsecondary educational institution.

- 4. Number of grants allowed. A person eligible under subsection 3 may receive a grant under the program for every semester the person is eligible until the person receives a degree from a public postsecondary educational institution.
 - **5. Funding.** The program is funded by the fund.

6. Rules. The authority shall adopt rules to carry out the purposes of this chapter. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined by Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

§12942. Educational Opportunity Grant Program for Family Members of Deceased Veterans, First Responders and Health Care Workers Fund

The Educational Opportunity Grant Program for Family Members of Deceased Veterans, First Responders and Health Care Workers Fund is established within and administered by the authority to fund grants under and administer the program. The fund is funded by appropriations, allocations or grants or donations by public or private sources, including a resource for postsecondary student financial aid that is related to a service or profession of the deceased parent or spouse under section 12941, subsection 3, paragraph A. The authority may engage in the solicitation of a grant or donation to be deposited into the fund. The authority shall deposit with the Treasurer of State to the credit of the fund money in the fund not currently needed by the authority to carry out the purposes of the fund, which may be invested as provided by law. Interest earned on investment of money under this section must be credited to the fund. Balances in the fund do not lapse but must be carried over to the next fiscal year. The authority may use principal of the fund to pay for the authority's reasonable expenses in administering the fund.

23 SUMMARY

This bill creates the Educational Opportunity Grant Program for Family Members of Deceased Veterans, First Responders and Health Care Workers, administered by the Finance Authority of Maine, to provide postsecondary education grants to eligible children and spouses of veterans, first responders and health care workers who die or contract a condition or illness that leads to their death. The program is funded by a fund that may accept appropriations, allocations, grants or donations from public and private sources, including financial aid resources, and the authority may solicit private donations for the fund.
