37 SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, replaces the resolve. The amendment includes an emergency preamble to reflect the need to immediately address safety in the Burton M. Cross Building and the State House in response to the increased violence seen at both the nation's capitol and several state capitols. The amendment requires the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to issue a

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request for proposals for and contract with a licensed security consultant to assess the security of the Burton M. Cross Building and the State House and provide specific recommendations on improving the security at these buildings to protect the buildings and the individuals working in and visiting them. The Department of Public Safety is required to determine which immediate changes to these buildings are necessary to increase security and protection in the short term, including the costs for each change. The Department of Administrative and Financial Services and the Department of Public Safety are both required to solicit input from the State House and Capitol Park Commission and the Legislative Council on the assessments and recommendations each is required to develop under this resolve. The Department of Public Safety is required to submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government by December 1, 2021. The Department of Administrative and Financial Services is required to submit a report to the joint standing committee by January 15, 2022. The committee may report out a bill in response to each report to the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.
