For purposes of this section, "electronic visit verification" means a system under which visits conducted as part of hospice services are electronically verified with respect to the type of service performed, the individual receiving the service, the date of the service, the location of service delivery, the individual providing the service and the time the service begins and ends.

30 31 32	for hospice services. The Department of Health and Human Services may not implement electronic visit verification earlier than March 1, 2025 for providers offering hospice services under the MaineCare program.

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health and human services matters on efforts to combat fraud, waste and abuse in the delivery of hospice services, shall include in the report information on federal initiatives that include Medicaid hospice providers and shall make recommendations regarding the application of electronic visit verification to hospice services under the MaineCare program.'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

9 This amendment replaces the bill and changes the title. It makes rules regarding 10 electronic visit verification for providers offering hospice services under the MaineCare program major substantive rules, prohibits the Department of Health and Human Services 11 12 from implementing electronic visit verification earlier than March 1, 2025 and directs the department by February 1, 2025 to report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature 13 having jurisdiction over health and human services matters on efforts to combat fraud, 14 15 waste and abuse in the delivery of hospice services, to include in the report information on federal initiatives that include Medicaid hospice providers and to make recommendations 16 17 regarding the application of electronic visit verification to hospice services under the 18 MaineCare program. The amendment also removes the emergency preamble and 19 emergency clause.
