The Bureau of General Services shall establish the price of office equipment for private sale to state employees in the same manner as for public sale pursuant to section 1813, subsection 6.

22 23 24	This bill allows the private sale of state surplus office equipment to state employees for the furnishing of home offices and requires that that equipment be priced in the same manner as for public sale.
