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SUMMARY

2 This amendment replaces the bill. It amends the laws governing the Maine Agriculture, 3 Food System and Forest Products Infrastructure Investment Advisory Board to require the 4 President of the Senate to appoint 3 members to the board instead of 5 members as proposed 5 in the bill and to require the Speaker of the House to appoint 4 members to the board instead of 5 members as proposed in the bill. The amendment defines "conflict of interest" as it 6 7 relates to the board. The amendment requires a producer that receives a disbursement from 8 the Maine Agriculture, Food and Forest Products Investment Fund to have a processing or 9 manufacturing facility that is located in the State or to be seeking to establish a new 10 processing or manufacturing facility that is located in the State. The amendment also requires a producer that receives a disbursement from the fund to use the disbursement to 11 12 support the operations of the producer's processing or manufacturing facility including, but not limited to, obtaining equipment and investing in supply chain infrastructure to grow, 13 14 harvest, process or manufacture agricultural, food or forest products used in commercial 15 products. Finally, the amendment requires a producer to obtain, to the extent practicable, 16 agricultural, food or forest products from a farm or a forest or waters in the State or from offshore waters to be collected in the State. 17
