2	This amendment replaces the bill. The amendment changes the definition of "eligible
3	criminal conviction" in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 15, section 2261, subsection 6
4	which identifies what is considered an eligible crime for an individual to file a post-
5	judgment motion to seal criminal history record information related to a conviction for that
5	crime, to include crimes committed prior to January 30, 2017 that are no longer considered
7	illegal under Maine's adult use cannabis laws.
