10 SUMMARY

 This bill requires the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to administer a program to assist a government entity or nonprofit organization, upon application by that government entity or nonprofit organization to the department, with the control of browntail moths. It also includes an appropriations and allocations section to provide funding for an Entomologist I position and a Senior Entomology Technician position in the department to support the management of forest insect pests.
