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9 Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section 10 number to read consecutively.

## **SUMMARY**

12 This amendment amends Public Law 2021, chapter 635 to allow a person who is a high 13 school graduate in the class of 2020, 2021, 2022 or 2023 to enroll for free in a Maine 14 community college in any semester in 2022 or 2023, not just the fall semester of 2022 or 15 2023 as enacted in Part OO.

16 This amendment also adds Part C, which:

17 1. Amends the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 17-A, section 1111-B, subsection 1, 18 paragraph B, as enacted by Public Law 2021, chapter 724, which provides protections from 19 arrest, prosecution and probation violations for a person who calls for assistance for a 20 person who is experiencing a suspected drug-related overdose or who is rendering aid to 21 such a person. This amendment also provides those protections to the person who is 22 experiencing a suspected drug-related overdose;

Amends Public Law 2021, chapter 635 to specify that the payments made pursuant
 to the COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program, as enacted in Part L, are not considered
 income for purposes of the municipal general assistance program;

Amends Title 28-B, section 505, which allows the sale of adult use marijuana
outside of a marijuana store at specified events under a permit issued by the Department of
Administrative and Financial Services, to delay the effective date until January 1, 2023;
and

4. Repeals a provision of Public Law 2021, chapter 736 that requires the Department
of Environmental Protection to adopt rules establishing procedures to ensure that persons
in environmental justice populations and frontline communities are provided with fair and
equitable access to the department's decision-making processes under the Maine Revised
Statutes, Title 38, sections 341-D and 341-H.
