Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:				
'Resolve, Directing the Department of Transportation to Develop and Adopt a Rail Corridor Use Vision Plan for State-owned Railroad Lines and to Seek Proposals for an Operator to Provide Passenger Rail Transit'				
Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and inserting the following:				
'Sec. 1. Rail Corridor Use Vision Plan. Resolved: That the Department of Transportation shall adopt the Rail Corridor Use Vision Plan, referred to in this resolve as "the vision plan," for the following state-owned railroad lines, referred to in this resolve as "the covered corridors":				
1. The Berlin Subdivision, referred to as the St. Lawrence and Atlantic Railroad, rail corridor from Portland to Auburn;				
2. The Lower Road rail corridor from Brunswick to Augusta;				
3. The Mountain Division rail corridor from Westbrook to Fryeburg; and				
4. The Rockland Branch rail corridor from Brunswick to Rockland.				
The vision plan must be consistent with the Department of Transportation's comprehensive long-range transportation plans and must be based on the advice of the advisory committee under section 2. The Department of Transportation shall use the vision plan to evaluate reasonable potential uses of the covered corridors including light rail operations and use the vision plan as a prioritization framework for the development of compatible multimodal uses, including passenger train service, freight train service and nonrail multimodal uses. When evaluating reasonable potential uses, the department shall evaluate the likelihood, benefits and costs of restoration of the covered corridors for rail use consistent with the requirements of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 23, chapter 615.				

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## **COMMITTEE AMENDMENT**

**Sec. 2. Advisory committee. Resolved:** That the Commissioner of Transportation shall establish by October 1, 2023 an advisory committee to advise the Commissioner of Transportation in adopting the vision plan under section 1. The advisory committee must consist of at least 11 members and not more than 15 members. The Commissioner of Economic and Community Development or the commissioner's designee shall serve on the advisory committee. The Commissioner of Transportation shall invite the participation of the following individuals to serve on the advisory committee:

- 8 1. A person representing another state agency, as determined appropriate by the 9 Commissioner of Transportation;
- 2. The Chief Executive Officer of the Portland Regional Chamber of Commerce or the
  chief executive officer's designee;
- 12 3. The President of the Bangor Region Chamber of Commerce or the president's13 designee;
- 14 4. A representative of the Kennebec Valley Council of Governments;
- 15 5. A representative of the Androscoggin Valley Council of Governments;
- 16 6. A representative of the Androscoggin Transportation Resource Center; and
  - 7. A person representing an organization advocating for rail use.

18 The Commissioner of Transportation may invite other persons with expertise in rail 19 logistics or infrastructure. The Commissioner of Transportation shall designate the chair 20 of the advisory committee. The advisory committee shall meet at the call of the chair and 21 shall hold a minimum of 6 public hearings, 2 of which must be in communities along the 22 covered corridors.

Sec. 3. Report. Resolved: That, by January 15, 2025, the Department of Transportation shall submit a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters that includes the vision plan adopted under section 1 together with any suggested legislation. After reviewing the report, the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters may report out a bill to the 132nd Legislature in 2025 related to the subject matter of the report.

**Sec. 4. Operator. Resolved:** That the Department of Transportation shall seek proposals for an operator to provide passenger rail transit service on one or more of the covered corridors. The scope of services must address legal and federal railroad administration requirements for any shared use or crossings of the CSX Transportation mainline corridor and the Genesee & Wyoming railroad.
