11	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and inserting the following:
12 13	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
14 15 16 17	Whereas, a provision of law providing that the Commissioner of Education may approve on a case-by-case basis waivers of the age requirements to allow a student who has reached 20 years of age before the start of the school year to be enrolled as a public secondary school student was repealed on July 1, 2020; and
18 19	Whereas, the Legislature has determined that this provision should be restored as soon as possible to minimize disruption of the education of such students; and
20 21 22 23	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
24	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
25 26	<b>Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §4502, sub-§5, ¶M,</b> as amended by PL 2009, c. 313, §2, is further amended to read:
27 28 29	M. The use of time-out areas <u>and physical restraint and seclusion</u> , administered in accordance with requirements adopted by the department and with this paragraph. The use of a time-out area is subject to the following:
30 31	(1) The time-out area must be well ventilated and sufficiently lighted. The time-out area may not be locked; and
32 33	(2) The time-out area must be designed to ensure the safety of the student so that the student is supervised by a professional staff member in the room or can be

observed from outside of the time-out area and can be heard by a person supervising the time-out area;

Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §4711, as amended by PL 2019, c. 106, §1, is further amended to read:

## §4711. Elementary course of study

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The basic course of study for the elementary schools must provide for the instruction of all students in <u>life and</u> career and education development, ready standards. English language arts, world languages, health education and physical education, mathematics, science and technology engineering, social studies and visual and performing arts, as described in the parameters for essential instruction and graduation requirements subject to the schedule specified in section 6209. Health education must include instruction that addresses the relationship between physical and mental health in order to enhance student understanding of attitudes toward and behavior relating to mental illness and to eliminate the stigma associated with mental illness.

Sec. 3. 20-A MRSA §4712, as amended by PL 2019, c. 106, §2, is further amended to read:

## §4712. Junior high school or middle school course of study

The basic course of study for the junior high schools or middle schools must provide for the instruction of all students in <u>life and</u> career and education development, <u>ready standards</u>, English language arts, health education and physical education, mathematics, science and <u>technology engineering</u>, social studies, visual and performing arts and world languages, as described in the parameters for essential instruction and graduation requirements subject to the schedule specified in section 6209. Health education must include instruction that addresses the relationship between physical and mental health in order to enhance student understanding of attitudes toward and behavior relating to mental illness and to eliminate the stigma associated with mental illness.

- **Sec. 4. 20-A MRSA §4721, sub-§1,** as enacted by PL 2009, c. 313, §13, is amended to read:
- 1. Comprehensive program of instruction. A secondary school shall provide a comprehensive program of instruction of at least 2 years in length, which must meet the requirements of this chapter and the parameters for essential instruction and graduation requirements established under section 6209. The program must include instruction for all students in <u>life and</u> career and education development, ready standards, English language arts, health education and physical education, mathematics, science and technology engineering, social studies, visual and performing arts and world languages.
  - **Sec. 5. 20-A MRSA §5201, sub-§3, ¶G** is enacted to read:
- G. A person who obtains a waiver from the commissioner pursuant to section 5206-A may enroll as a public secondary school student.
  - Sec. 6. 20-A MRSA §5206-A is enacted to read:

## §5206-A. Waiver

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The superintendent may request that the commissioner approve on a case-by-case basis waivers of the age requirements under section 5201 to allow a student who has reached 20 years of age before the start of the school year to be enrolled as a public secondary school student. The commissioner may grant a waiver upon finding that there are unforeseeable circumstances or undue hardship and that the request that the school administrative unit has submitted is reasonable. The application for a waiver must contain:

- 1. **Documentation.** Documentation of actions taken to meet the requirements prior to applying for the waiver;
- **2. Description.** A description of the unforeseeable circumstances or undue hardship, including financial hardship, that led to the application; and
- 3. Statement. A statement explaining how the waiver requested will not create learning inequities for the students enrolled in the schools in the school administrative unit.
- **Sec. 7. 20-A MRSA §6209, first ¶,** as amended by PL 2015, c. 489, §3, is further amended to read:

The department in consultation with the state board shall establish and implement a comprehensive, statewide system of learning results, which may include a core of standards in English language arts and mathematics for kindergarten to grade 12 established in common with the other states, as set forth in this section and in department rules implementing this section and other curricular requirements. The department must establish accountability standards at all grade levels in the areas of mathematics; reading; and science and technology engineering. The department shall establish parameters for essential instruction in English language arts; mathematics; science and technology engineering; social studies; eareer and education development life and career ready standards; visual and performing arts; health, physical education and wellness; and world languages. Only a public school, a public charter school as defined in section 2401, subsection 9 or a private school approved for tuition purposes that enrolls at least 60% publicly funded students, as determined by the previous school year's October and April average enrollment, is required to participate in the system of learning results set forth in this section and in department rules implementing this section and other curricular requirements. The commissioner shall develop accommodation provisions for instances where course content conflicts with sincerely held religious beliefs and practices of a student's parent or guardian. The system must be adapted to accommodate children with disabilities as defined in section 7001, subsection 1-B.

  - A. Career Life and education development career ready standards;

The commissioner shall adopt rules to implement this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are major substantive rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
19 20	<b>Emergency clause.</b> In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.'
21	SUMMARY
22 23	This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, adds an emergency preamble and clause, strikes and replaces the bill and does the following.
24 25	1. It amends the school approval requirements to authorize the Department of Education to adopt rules on physical restraint and seclusion.
26 27 28 29	2. It enacts a provision to restore language that was repealed on July 1, 2020 to continue to allow the Commissioner of Education to approve on a case-by-case basis waivers of the age requirements to allow a student who has reached 20 years of age before the start of the school year to be enrolled as a public secondary school student.
30 31 32	3. It amends the parameters for the system of learning results to reflect that the career and development standard is now called the life and career ready standard and the science and technology standard is now called the science and engineering standard.
33 34 35	4. It authorizes the Commissioner of Education to adopt major substantive rules on reasonable accommodations for students who hold written certification for the medical use of marijuana.
