**An Act Regarding Career and Technical Education and
Memoranda of Understanding with Community Colleges**

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §8308** is enacted to read:

3 **§8308. Memorandum of understanding with community colleges**

4 A center or region may enter into a memorandum of understanding with a local
5 community college to provide career and technical education to residents of the
6 municipalities served by that region, center or satellite program as an alternative
7 organizational method of delivering career and technical education. A memorandum of
8 understanding pursuant to this section must include the following components:

9 **1. Schedules.** Notwithstanding section 4801, subsection 2-A, the center or region and
10 the community college schedules must be aligned to allow career and technical education
11 students to take courses at the community college that fulfill the requirements of the system
12 of learning results pursuant to section 6209:

13 **2. College credit.** Upon an assessment that a career and technical education course or
14 program meets the standards of a community college course or program of study, the
15 community college shall award the student college credit for that course or program, as
16 applicable:

17 **3. College acceptance.** A procedure must be established by which career and technical
18 education students who have successfully completed a required set of courses in a
19 postsecondary program may automatically enroll at the Maine Community College System
20 or University of Maine System to complete that postsecondary program; and

21 **4. Funding.** Funding for career and technical education students attending courses at a
22 community college must be provided in accordance with chapter 208-A.

23 **SUMMARY**

24 This bill provides that a career and technical education center or region may enter into
25 a memorandum of understanding with a local community college to provide career and
26 technical education to residents of the municipalities served by that region, center or
27 satellite program as an alternative organizational method of delivering career and technical
28 education. The memorandum of understanding must include provisions that the schedule
29 must be aligned to allow students to fulfill the requirements of the Maine Learning Results,
30 students must be awarded college credit, where applicable, students must receive automatic
31 admission to the University of Maine System or Maine Community College System to
32 complete a postsecondary program that was begun at the career and technical education
33 center or region and funding must be provided through the Aspirations program.
