An Act Establishing Employers' Right To File a Complaint To Enforce Payment of Workers' Compensation Premiums

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 39-A MRSA §324, sub-§5 is enacted to read:
3 4 5 6	5. Failure to pay workers' compensation premiums. The board may issue a penalty in accordance with this section to an employer that has procured insurance coverage for the payment of compensation and other benefits and has failed to pay workers' compensation premiums to the insurance carrier.
7	Sec. 2. 39-A MRSA §362 is enacted to read:
8	§362. Employer complaint
9 10 11 12	An employer required to pay workers' compensation premiums may file a complaint to the board if that employer believes another employer is failing to pay workers' compensation premiums to an insurance carrier as required pursuant to chapter 9. Upon receipt of a complaint filed by an employer, the board shall:
13	1. Investigate complaint. Investigate the complaint;
14 15	2. Enforcement action. Take enforcement action, if the board determines it necessary; and
16 17	3. Notify insurance carrier. Notify the insurance carrier if an enforcement action has been taken against an employer.
18 19 20 21 22 23	Sec. 3. Board to submit report. The Workers' Compensation Board shall submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing describing any actions taken by the board pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 39-A, section 362, including any suggested legislation necessary to further implement that provision, no later than January 1, 2022. The committee may submit legislation related to the report to the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature.

25 26 27 28	This bill allows an employer required to pay workers' compensation insurance premiums to file a complaint with the Workers' Compensation Board if that employer believes another employer is required to purchase workers' compensation insurance coverage but has failed to pay the premiums.
