Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 13 14 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 15 Whereas, the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Public Law 117-2, establishes the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund; and 16 17 Whereas, the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund will be used to provide funds 18 to the State to respond to the COVID-19 public health emergency and to its negative 19 economic effects, including by providing assistance to households and small and nonprofit 20 businesses, aid to affected industries, such as the tourism, travel and hospitality industries, 21 and assistance to workers performing essential work during the COVID-19 pandemic; and 22 Whereas, Maine's nation-leading COVID-19 vaccination rate is helping Maine turn 23 the corner on this pandemic but it is crucial to support employers in getting through this 24 difficult time; and 25 Whereas, the economic disruption of the COVID-19 pandemic has made investment 26 in Maine's heritage industries, farming, fishing and forest products, urgent to stabilize these 27 core economic engines of Maine's rural areas. By investing in these industries, the State can help these key economic sectors recover, develop new products and market 28 29 opportunities and sustain important, good-paying jobs across the State; and 30 Whereas, health insurance premiums, already a significant expense for small 31 businesses in Maine, worsened during the COVID-19 pandemic. From March 2017 to 32 March 2020, insurance premiums in the small group market in Maine rose by nearly 33%, 33 while enrollment declined by 18%, from 61,200 to 50,200. This Act provides small 34 businesses short-term relief from rising health insurance premiums as those businesses 35 recover from the pandemic; and

Whereas, Maine's investment in research and development, a key driver of economic growth, has ranked among the lowest in the nation. The funds in this Act are necessary to overcome that ranking by making strategic investments in forward-looking industries and economic opportunities in emerging industries to grow the economy; and

Whereas, the health care industry employs more workers than any other job sector in this State but critical health care worker shortages that existed in this State prior to the pandemic have been exacerbated by the pandemic. These shortages limit access to quality care, particularly in behavioral health and long-term care; increase costs; and affect Maine's ability to attract talented workers since quality health care is often a priority for relocation. The funds provided in this Act will expand industry partnerships, build career ladders, promote and encourage opportunities in rural health care settings and support diversification of the workforce; and

Whereas, although clean energy jobs are the fastest-growing job sector in the country, Maine lags other New England states in its number of clean energy jobs per capita and Maine's overall shortage of skilled workers is an obstacle to filling these jobs. The clean energy partnership established in this Act supports clean energy and energy efficiency job growth through workforce development programs developed in partnership with industry and education leaders; and

Whereas, Maine is 17th in the nation for demand satisfied by imports, and many small businesses lack the necessary resources to expand their customer bases, and this situation was exacerbated by the disruption caused by the pandemic. This Act establishes a domestic trade pilot program to provide small to medium-sized businesses in this State support to identify and access new markets by providing market data, marketing support and consulting services; and

Whereas, with Maine as just one of 10 locations in the United States to successfully attract new residents to live and work remotely during the pandemic, funding is necessary to further strengthen the attraction and integration of remote workers into Maine communities and is an economic growth opportunity; and

Whereas, the need for critical infrastructure improvements, such as upgrades to water treatment plants, storage reservoirs and pipe distribution systems, exceeds the State's current funding capacity. Funds provided by this Act will address a significant backlog of drinking water projects and help municipalities leverage further federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 funds; and

Whereas, despite the appeal of state parks, as evidenced by the 3,000,000 visitors in 2020 and 63% increase in campground reservations this year, park infrastructure is outdated, lacking funding to be properly maintained and, in some cases, unsafe. The pandemic highlighted the inadequacy of plumbing and sanitation facilities and the need for structural repairs to park roads, bridges, shelters and staff housing. Funds provided by this Act will address capital maintenance and improvement needs and represent the first meaningful investment in state parks in more than a decade; and

Sec. C-1. Small Business Health Insurance Premium Support Program established. The Small Business Health Insurance Premium Support Program, referred to in this section as "the program," is established within the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Bureau of Insurance as a temporary program to provide payments to small group health insurance carriers in the State to reduce insurance premium costs for small businesses and their employees. The program must provide for the issue of relief payments to small group health insurance carriers based on actual credits made monthly by the carriers and ensure the payments result in a reduction of small group health insurance premiums of \$50 per employee per month for 18 months starting July 2021, with an additional reduction for family coverage. The program must ensure that the employer and employee share in the reduction pro rata according to their contributions to the premium. The bureau shall audit small group health insurance carriers for compliance and to ensure that the premium reductions provided through the program are not recaptured through premium increases in the next insurance renewal following the expiration of the Small group health insurance carriers shall notify their small business policyholders of the program, the purpose of the program and the end date of the program.

The bureau shall adopt routine technical rules pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A to carry out the purposes of the program.

The Finance Authority of Maine shall establish the Maine Health Care Provider Loan Repayment Pilot Program, referred to in this section as "the program," for certain health care professionals who commit to living and working in Maine for at least 3 years. Under the program, the authority shall pay up to \$25,000 per year and, in aggregate, the lesser of \$75,000 and 50% of the recipient's outstanding loan balance. The program terminates when the funds allocated pursuant to this Part to the Maine Health Care Provider Loan Repayment Program Fund established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 12953 are fully expended or by December 31, 2024, whichever occurs first, unless other funding is made available to carry out the purpose of the program. Costs and expenses of maintaining, servicing and administering the Maine Health Care Provider Loan Repayment Program Fund and of administering the program may be paid out of amounts in the fund.

The authority shall adopt routine technical rules pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A to carry out the purposes of the program, including application requirements and program eligibility.

In the opinion of the department, initial testing or screening performed at the expense of the owner indicates the need for additional testing at a cost in excess of \$150 to determine whether that water supply contains contaminants potentially hazardous to human health and that additional testing is essential to the maintenance of public health; or

 B. In the opinion of the department, there is reason to suspect that a private residential
 - B. In the opinion of the department, there is reason to suspect that a private residential water supply may be affected by contamination potentially hazardous to human health and that additional testing is essential to the maintenance of public health. In making such a determination, the department shall consider the following:
 - (1) The proximity of the private residential water supply to a known or suspected source of contamination;
 - (2) The proximity of the private residential water supply to another private well or water supply known to be contaminated;
 - (3) Information provided in writing to the department by a physician who has seen or treated a person and who has identified contaminated drinking water as a possible cause of the person's condition or symptoms; or
 - (4) Information provided by the owner or a user of the private residential water supply voluntarily or in response to questions asked by personnel of the department.

The department may shall waive all fees incurred in connection with the testing of a private residential water supply upon a showing of indigency.

Sec. BB-2. 22 MRSA §2602-A, sub-§3 is enacted to read:

- 3. Well water testing for low-income residents. The department shall establish and maintain a program through the Health and Environmental Testing Laboratory established in section 565 to provide free testing for arsenic of the private residential water supplies of low-income residents of the State. The department may not charge any fee or recover any cost as otherwise permitted by this chapter for a test of a private residential water supply performed for a low-income resident of the State under the program established pursuant to this subsection. As used in this subsection, "low-income resident" means a person who receives assistance under the MaineCare program or the food supplement program under section 3104.
- **Sec. BB-3. 22 MRSA §2660-U,** as amended by PL 2017, c. 475, Pt. C, §7, is further amended to read:

§2660-U. Fees

The Except as provided in section 2602-A, subsection 3, the Health and Environmental Testing Laboratory established in section 565 shall collect a fee not to exceed \$10 from a person or entity ordering a water test for a water sample from a residential private drinking water well. The fees collected must be credited to the Private Well Safe Drinking Water Fund established in section 2660-W and used for the purpose of increasing testing of residential private drinking water wells. If more than one test of a water sample from the same residential private drinking water well is conducted, the department may waive payment of a fee established under this section for a one-year period. SUMMARY

This amendment makes allocations from the funds provided to the State from the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund, or ARP State Fiscal Recovery Fund.

PART A

This Part provides new and renewed support for Maine businesses, particularly small businesses, to ensure their doors stay open, their workers are safe and on the job and the Maine economy is secure in the short term by providing one-time funding to the Department of Economic and Community Development for loans or loan guarantees through the Finance Authority of Maine for businesses having difficulty securing investment capital due to the COVID-19 pandemic and provides capital for rural development projects through the Maine Rural Development Authority.

PART B

This Part provides one-time funds to:

- 1. Support Maine's farms and food processors to ensure the sustainability of farms and farm families, increase the supply of local food to meet state food consumption goals and enhance Maine's agricultural exports while reducing Maine's reliance on food imports;
- 2. Provide economic recovery and development opportunities in the forest products industry to address reduced demand from the economic disruption of the COVID-19 pandemic and other industry impacts; and
- 3. Establish competitive grants for seafood processors and dealers to upgrade or replace aging or failing infrastructure, or reengineer and retool facilities, in response to product changes or safety protocols necessary as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

PART C

This Part requires the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Bureau of Insurance to establish the Small Business Health Insurance Premium Support Program to provide small businesses short-term relief from rising health insurance premiums as they recover from the COVID-19 pandemic. The program will provide \$39,000,000 to small

group health insurance carriers in Maine to reduce insurance premium costs for small businesses and their employees to provide financial flexibility to small businesses and help employees keep healthy and working. Small group health insurance premiums will be reduced by \$50 per employee per month for 18 months starting July 2021, with an additional reduction for family coverage. The employer and employee will share the reduction pro rata according to their contributions to the premium. The bureau will issue relief payments to the health carriers based on actual credits made monthly by the carriers. The bureau will audit small group health insurance carriers for compliance and to make sure there is no recapture of discounts through premium increases. Carriers are required to notify their small group business policyholders of the program, its purpose and when it will end.

12 PART D

This Part requires the State Controller to transfer \$80,000,000 of the ARP State Fiscal Recovery Fund to the Department of Labor, Unemployment Compensation Fund.

PART E

This Part provides funds to support new businesses, along with entrepreneurs who recently acquired Maine businesses, and help them survive the COVID-19 pandemic and set a strong foundation for future growth.

19 PART F

This Part provides funds to support technical assistance, outreach, training, marketing and access-to-capital programs for business owners from underrepresented backgrounds, build upon successful support programs to scale them more broadly and explore how the State could encourage business diversity through state procurement.

PART G

This Part provides funds to expand public sector business support through increased research and development spending, investments in innovation and public-private partnerships to generate new economic activity in Maine.

28 PART H

This Part provides funds to expand industry partnerships, build career ladders, such as from a certified nursing assistant to a registered nurse, promote and incentivize opportunities in rural health care settings and support diversification of the workforce. The funds will also create one-time dedicated pools of funding in a public-private partnership model for hospitals and for nursing homes to help recruit and retain workers in critical areas.

35 PART I

This Part establishes the clean energy partnership to support clean energy and energy efficiency job growth through workforce development programs developed in partnership with industry and education leaders. This sector-focused initiative will establish clear training pathways for clean energy careers, support internships and apprenticeship programs and create an online platform for attracting workers, sharing training opportunities and highlighting job opportunities. The partnership will also target investments to encourage innovative clean energy companies in Maine through the Maine Technology Institute.

PART J

This Part establishes a domestic trade pilot program to pro-

This Part establishes a domestic trade pilot program to provide small to medium-sized businesses in Maine support to identify and access new markets by providing market data, marketing support and consulting services.

This Part provides funding to support worker attraction and relocation programs that encourage long-term residency in Maine, which are important to help solve economic and workforce challenges that have increased in urgency due to an evolving and unaffordable housing market, tourism and other businesses seeking to recover and a shortage of available workers.

11 PART L

This Part provides funding to expand the Maine career exploration program, part of the State's 10-year economic strategy. To help students explore career opportunities geared to their interests, the program will provide students one paid internship between their junior year of high school and one year after graduation. To provide accessible and affordable education and training for working adults, the program will also offer incentives and assistance to workers and employers to access training and skills development opportunities.

PART M

This Part provides funds to support outreach to potential remote workers and their employers; grants for communities to welcome and integrate remote workers and their families; and funding for collaborative workspaces to help remote workers engage in local communities and economies. This Part will also allow an expansion of the Working Communities Challenge in partnership with Federal Reserve Bank of Boston.

PART N

This Part provides funding to meet workforce development needs in emerging economic sectors, in alignment with the 10-year economic development strategy. These funds will support infrastructure and equipment upgrades for Maine's career and technical education centers that advance programs and curricula for high school students, new University of Maine System and Maine Community College System targeted workforce programs and competitive grants available to all higher education institutions in Maine.

PART O

This Part provides funding to promote diversity, equity and inclusion in Maine's workforce. These funds will support engagement with Maine's racial and ethnic communities, tribal communities, the State's Permanent Commission on the Status of Racial, Indigenous and Maine Tribal Populations and other underrepresented and marginalized communities to reduce economic and employment barriers and advance opportunity for Maine people of diverse backgrounds, cultures, races, genders and religions.

40 PART P

This Part provides funding to help the State's 10-year economic strategy move forward by enhancing coordination efforts in the labor market. There are gaps between the types

of skills needed and existing and available workers and communication gaps for workers to match with available jobs. This Part offers an opportunity to build new infrastructure and start pilot programs to support skill advancement and outreach and build the bridge that connects workers to open opportunities, establish services for emerging industries, expand supports for employers and workers and enhance program outreach and evaluation.

PART O

This Part provides funds to support making licensing easier and faster for businesses and more transparent and accessible to the public through the launch of an online licensing system for environmental and other state licenses. This Part is intended to result in a contract with a software company for the licensing system, to put funds into the economy quickly and multiply it through savings for businesses and the State.

PART R

This Part provides funding:

- 1. For expansion of affordable high-speed broadband access in the State;
- 2. For financing programs through the Maine State Housing Authority for affordable housing options;
- 3. For acceleration of weatherization and efficiency upgrades for Maine homes, especially for low-income, older Maine residents and renters; assisting municipal, county, school and community organizations to secure efficiency grants by providing matching funds; and supporting incentives for industries and businesses to invest in energy cost savings and efficiency measures;
- 4. For grants to renovate, expand or construct child care facilities to increase availability of accessible and affordable child care;
- 5. To the Department of Education for grants to school administrative units to establish new or expanded public prekindergarten programs to increase the number of children accessing high-quality prekindergarten with priority given to programs that engage in community partnerships, provide longer duration of education, support inclusive programming and enroll socioeconomically disadvantaged students;
- 6. On a one-time basis, to the Department of Transportation for the municipal, regional and state infrastructure adaptation improvements that support public safety and emergency management and infrastructure resiliency;
- 7. For support of initiatives or competitive grants for local, regional or state workforce transportation pilot projects aimed at connecting workers to employment opportunities, especially in rural Maine areas where transportation options are limited, thereby promoting economic security, workforce development and community benefits. This funding can be used for capital and operating costs including program start-up costs; and
- 8. On a one-time basis, to expand state, municipal and other publicly accessible electric vehicle charging stations and related infrastructure. These funds will be administered by the Department of Transportation in collaboration with the Efficiency Maine Trust, will support the continued expansion of electric vehicle charging stations at town buildings, school buildings, state facilities, other public facilities and private businesses open to the general public.

1 PART S

This Part provides, through the Department of Health and Human Services, Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention's drinking water program, funds to address the significant backlog of drinking water projects and help municipalities leverage further federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 funds. This Part provides \$22,000,000 for municipal wastewater and infrastructure projects, helps leverage local American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 funds and accelerates the timeline of essential local projects that protect public health, provide community benefits, reduce the burden for local ratepayers and support construction jobs. Additionally, this Part provides \$3,000,000 for the Small Community Grant Program, which supports septic repair and replacement projects, supporting water quality and public health for communities, water bodies and fisheries.

PART T

This Part provides funds to address \$50,000,000 in capital maintenance and improvement needs at state parks for park infrastructure that is outdated, lacking funding to be properly maintained and, in some cases, unsafe.

16 PART U

This Part provides funding to support the replacement of antiquated infrastructure at the 88-year-old New Gloucester fish hatchery, create needed capacity at Grand Lake Stream hatchery to manage fish disease threats and conserve an endemic population of landlocked Atlantic salmon and improve the quality of hatchery effluent at all 8 fish culture facilities, which will improve protections to receiving waters.

PART V

This Part, in order to allow commercial fishing and aquaculture industries to recover from the market disruptions and economic challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, provides the Department of Marine Resources funds to fulfill the department's industry and management mandates. These funds will upgrade equipment to support public health monitoring as it pertains to shellfish and water quality with the goal of maximizing harvest opportunities in both the aquaculture and wild shellfish sectors.

PART W

This Part provides funds to establish a matching grant program to support electricity grid upgrades that will reduce barriers for economic development by new or struggling businesses, especially those in heritage industries in rural areas of the State.

PART X

This Part provides funding to address the need for accessible, safe and efficient state government services and programs, especially those that can be managed online or through remote programs. This Part provides funds for targeted upgrades to make state systems more user-friendly and for the cybersecurity needed to ensure safe state operations. These funds will also be used for required heating, ventilation and efficiency upgrades to promote healthy working environments and long-term operational savings.

PART Y

This Part provides funds for financial oversight of federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 funds, including state discretionary and direct funds, as well local pass-through

funds. Oversight includes coordination, processing, tracking, reporting, reconciling, compliance, auditing and program guidance monitoring and summarizing. In order to meet federal requirements, significant reporting is needed, as well as consistent, transparent updates for the Legislature and Maine citizens. These funds may be used for limited-period positions, project management, contractors and consultant support.

PART Z

This Part allows the adjustment of allocations made by this Act but only within the same department or agency that received the original allocation or, if for the same purpose as the original allocation, between departments or agencies during fiscal year 2021-22 and only on the recommendation of the State Budget Officer and approval of the Governor. The Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services is required to report these adjustments at least quarterly to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs.

PART AA

This Part left blank intentionally.

16 PART BB

This Part requires the Department of Health and Human Services to waive fees incurred in connection with the testing of private residential water supplies upon a showing of indigency. The Part directs the department to establish a program, through the Health and Environmental Testing Laboratory, to provide free testing for arsenic of the private residential water supplies of low-income residents of the State. The Part requires that, beginning on January 1, 2022 and every 5 years thereafter, landlords of residential buildings test for arsenic each private drinking water well used to provide water to a tenant of the landlord. The Part also requires the department to review recent research regarding arsenic toxicity and levels suitable for consumption, to amend its rules to revise the maximum contaminant level for arsenic and requires the Maine Public Drinking Water Commission within the department to include information about the status of this review and rules adoption in its annual report under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 2660-C, subsection 4, paragraph H until such rules are finally adopted.

PART CC

32 PART DD

This Part establishes a pilot program to allow the parent of a child who is eligible for in-home personal care services under the MaineCare program to register as a personal care agency and receive reimbursement for providing those services to the child. The parent must have made reasonable efforts to obtain regular in-home personal care services and passed a background check. An individual who is not a parent of the child must be designated as the employer and must be approved as the employer by both the parent and the Department of Health and Human Services. The pilot program is established for fiscal years 2021-22 and 2022-23 and the amount of expenditures is capped at \$465,000.
