Eligibility.</b> A farmer in the State may apply for a grant under the program if the farmer needs to establish a source for irrigation water to alleviate the risk of crop losses due to drought. The source for irrigation water must be sustainable, environmentally sound and affordable.

Farmers Drought Relief Grant Program Fund.</b> The Farmers Drought Relief Grant Program Fund is established as a nonlapsing fund to provide funding to achieve the purposes of the program. The fund consists of any funds received from private and public sources. The fund must be held separate and apart from all other money, funds and accounts. Any balance remaining in the fund at the end of any fiscal year must be carried forward to the next fiscal year.

funding limits. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as

5 Sec. 2. Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to examine ways to streamline permitting new sources of water for farmers. The Department 6 of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Bureau of Agriculture, Food and Rural 7 8 Resources shall work with the Department of Environmental Protection and the Maine 9 Land Use Planning Commission and other appropriate agencies to examine the permitting 10 process for farmers seeking to secure permits for new sources of water for irrigation and to 11 develop recommendations, including suggested legislation, to streamline the permitting process. No later than January 1, 2023, the department shall submit a report with findings 12 and recommendations to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction 13 14 over agriculture, conservation and forestry matters. 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Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

## SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, establishes the Farmers Drought Relief Grant Program to assist farmers in the State to overcome the adverse effects of drought conditions by providing grants, rather than a disaster relief grant program for potato farmers as in the bill. The amendment specifies that a farmer may apply for a grant if the farmer needs to establish a source for irrigation water to alleviate the risk of crop losses due to drought.

The amendment also directs the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, 11 12 Bureau of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources to work with the Department of Environmental Protection and the Maine Land Use Planning Commission and other 13 appropriate agencies to examine the permitting process for farmers seeking to secure 14 permits for new sources of water for irrigation and to develop recommendations, including 15 suggested legislation, to streamline the permitting process. The department is required to 16 submit a report with findings and recommendations to the joint standing committee of the 17 Legislature having jurisdiction over agriculture, conservation and forestry matters no later 18 than January 1, 2023. The joint standing committee is authorized to submit a bill to the 19 First Regular Session of the 131st Legislature relating to the subject matter of the report. 20
