2. The committee reviewed a proposal to restructure the Legislative Information Technology Office to respond to the Legislature's increased needs for Information Technology resources and support. The committee requested additional detail from the Secretary of the Senate, the Clerk of the House, and the Executive Director, and deferred action on the proposal pending receipt of the additional information. 1. General Fund Revenue Update (see attached)

General Fund revenue was over budget by \$28.7 million (4.3%) for the month of April and over budget by \$214.1 million (5.1%) for the fiscal year to date. **These positive variances do not reflect the May 2023 revenue forecast, which increased budgeted General Fund revenue by \$223.2 million for FY 2023.** FY 2023 General Fund revenue through April 2023 was only slightly above General Fund revenue through April in FY 2022.

Individual income tax revenue was under budget by \$4.2 million for the month but over budget by \$134.2 million (7.1%) for the fiscal year to date. For the month, withholding and estimated payments were below budget, final payments exceeded budget and tax refunds were below budgeted levels (a positive impact on revenue). Corporate income tax revenue was \$37.2 million above budget for April and \$67.4 million (22.7%) above budget for the fiscal year to date. Sales and use tax revenue for April (March sales) was \$3.6 million above budget for the month and \$19.3 million (1.1%) above budget for the fiscal year to date.

Highway Fund revenue was under budget by \$0.2 million (-0.8%) for the month of April but over budget by \$7.5 million (2.7%) for the fiscal year to date. These positive variances do not reflect the May 2023 revenue forecast, which increased budgeted Highway Fund revenue by \$4.8 million for FY 2023. FY 2023 Highway Fund revenue through April 2023 was 0.2% less than FY 2022 Highway Fund revenue through April 2022.

Fuel tax revenue was slightly below budget for the month of April but was \$1.6 million (0.9%) greater than budget for the fiscal year to date. Motor vehicle registrations and fees were below budgeted by \$0.4 million for the month but exceeded budgeted levels by \$5.1 million (6.2%) for the fiscal year to date.

3. Cash Balances Update

The average balance in the cash pool for April was \$3,907.9 million, an increase of \$102.0 million from March's average of \$3,805.9 million. The increase was primarily the result of increases in General Fund balances partially offset by decreases in Other Special Revenue Funds and Independent Agency Funds balances. The average Highway Fund balance for April was \$37.0 million, an increase of \$11.8 million from March's average of \$25.2 million.

4. Economic and Revenue Forecast -Meetings

The Revenue Forecasting Committee (RFC) met on Friday April 28^{th} to review and update the revenue forecast and released its <u>May 1st report</u> the next week.
