LD 8 An Act to Increase Support for the Modernization of the Board of Pesticides Control by Increasing the Annual Pesticide Registration Fee

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 22 increases the annual fee to register a pesticide within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Board of Pesticides Control from \$160 to \$215.

LD 24 An Act to Prohibit Certain Open Burning Under a Red Flag Warning and Regulate Recreational Campfires

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 56 prohibits the director of the Bureau of Forestry, within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, from issuing a permit or other permission for open burning to take place in a geographic area subject to a red flag warning. The law provides an exception for wild blueberry growers by allowing the director or director's delegate to issue a permit for a controlled burn on a commercially managed wild blueberry field in a geographic area subject to a red flag warning as long as the application for the permit includes a prescribed burn plan approved by the issuing authority.

The law requires the director or the director's delegate to revoke a permit for open burning in a geographic area in which a red flag warning is in effect, except that the director or the director's delegate is not required to revoke a permit for a controlled burn on a commercially managed wild blueberry field during the period in which a red flag warning is in effect if the permit includes an approved prescribed burn plan.

The law clarifies that a red flag warning is a forecast warning issued by the United States Department of Commerce, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, National Weather Service in consultation with the Bureau of Forestry.

The law prohibits a person who kindles or uses a recreational campfire from allowing the recreational campfire to exceed 3 feet in diameter on the ground at the base of the fire or 3 feet in height; the law exempts a licensed camp facility from this prohibition.

The law prohibits open burning, both permissible open burning with a permit and permissible open burning without a permit, during the period in which a red flag warning is in effect; the law exempts from this prohibition open burning without a permit at a licensed camping facility and at campsites under the jurisdiction of the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry or the Baxter State Park Authority, as long as the campsite and the use of out-of-door fires and charcoal and gas grills at the campsite comply with department rules.

LD 285 An Act to Remove the Requirement for Wild Blueberry Transportation Permits

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 18 removes the requirement that persons transporting wild blueberries have a transportation permit.

LD 289 Amend the Laws Governing the Advisory Committee on the Fund to Address PFAS Contamination

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 212 provides legislative per diem for public members of the Advisory Committee on the Fund To Address PFAS Contamination. The law provides that members who are Legislators continue to serve until a successor is appointed. The law also removes the requirement that the advisory committee report annually to the joint standing committees of the Legislature having jurisdiction over agricultural matters and environmental matters on activities of the advisory committee and issues relating to the purposes and the use of the Fund To Address PFAS Contamination. Under current law, the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry is required to report annually to the joint standing committees of the Legislature having jurisdiction over agriculture, conservation and forestry; environment and natural resources; and health and human services matter on the status of carrying out the purposes of the fund.

LD 315 An Act to Provide Funding For Programs Benefiting Maine Farmers

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 427 implements some of the recommendations of the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry's January 2023 report, "Findings and Recommendations for Streamlining Permitting New Sources of Water for Irrigation in Maine."

The law provides a one-time appropriation of \$35,000 in fiscal year 2023-24 in order for the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Farmers Drought Relief Grant Program Fund program, Other Special Revenue Funds account in Public Law 2023, chapter 17, Part G to be used for contracted services to review and overhaul the current water withdrawal permitting process.

The law establishes one limited-period Environmental Specialist II position, which ends June 7, 2025, within the Maine Land Use Planning Commission.

LD 384 An Act to Provide Emergency Aid to Dairy Farmers Affected by the Crisis in Production Costs

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 429 requires the transfer of \$500,000 on or before July 30, 2024 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Milk Commission program, Other Special Revenue Funds account to provide one-time volatility payments to Maine milk producers who produced milk and reported production information to the Maine Milk Commission in calendar year 2022 and are currently participating in the dairy stabilization program.

LD 390 Resolve, Regarding Legislative Review of Portions of Chapter 25: Standards for Placing Wood into Stream Channels to Enhance Cold Water Fisheries Habitat, a Major Substantive Rule of the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Bureau of Forestry

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 6 authorizes final adoption of Chapter 25: Standards for Placing Wood into Stream Channels to Enhance Cold Water Fisheries Habitat, a major substantive rule of the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Bureau of Forestry, contingent on clarification of the effective date of the rule.

Resolve 2023, chapter 6 was finally passed as an emergency measure effective April 10, 2023.

LD 415 An Act to Allow Nonalcoholic Sparkling Cider to Be Sold in Maine

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 175 exempts nonalcoholic carbonated cider labeled as "sparkling cider" from the labeling requirements for cider.

LD 574 An Act to Amend the Laws Governing Working Waterfront Covenants

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 70 allows certain nonprofit organizations whose purposes or powers include retaining or protecting coastal community values, culture or heritage, coastal habitat or real property that provides coastal water access to hold working waterfront covenants.

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LD 595 An Act to Establish the Companion Animal Sterilization Program in the Maine Revised Statutes

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 484 establishes the Companion Animal Sterilization Program, previously in Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry rules, in statute. The law allows the department to be the administrator of the Companion Animal Sterilization Fund in the event that the department is unable to contract with a suitable animal welfare organization.

LD 782 An Act to Support Statewide Economic Opportunities Through Strategic Investments of Property and Funds, Including Emergency Relief Funds

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 120 allows the Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, subject to the approval of the Governor, to apply for and accept on behalf of the State emergency relief funds. The law specifies that funds and other personal or real property accepted by the commissioner on behalf of the State be for the purpose of economic opportunity, business growth and other strategic investments. The law requires the commissioner to adopt rules to implement and administer grant or other fund disbursement programs of the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry and authorizes the commissioner to adjudicate appeals of grant or other disbursement decisions made under the programs.

LD 797 Resolve, to Authorize the Conveyance of Real Property to the Capitol Area Recreation Association

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 109 directs the Director of the Bureau of Parks and Lands within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to convey by quitclaim deed with servitudes to the Capitol Area Recreation Association for \$1 on or before July 1, 2024 all of the State's interest in a parcel of land in Augusta, Maine comprising playing fields and other community recreation areas along Piggery Road, which is currently the subject of a lease dated January 1, 1992 between the Bureau of Parks and Lands and the Capitol Area Recreation Association.

LD 834 An Act to Ensure Transparency in the Labeling of Meat as Grass-fed

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 74 prohibits a person from selling, offering for sale or distributing within the State or selling, offering for sale or serving in any retail food establishment or eating establishment any meat or meat product labeled or advertised as "grass-fed" or by similar

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designation unless the ruminant animal was grass-fed. The Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry may waive the determination that meat or a meat product is misbranded if the commissioner finds a waiver is warranted due to inadvertent exposure of the animal to nonforage feedstuffs or because incidental supplementation with nonforage feedstuffs was necessary to ensure the well-being of the animal during adverse environmental or physical conditions.

LD 901 Resolve, to Establish a Stakeholder Group to Inform the Development of a Farm Apprenticeship Pilot Program

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 110 requires the Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to convene a stakeholder group to develop recommendations for a potential farm apprenticeship pilot program. The law directs the commissioner to report the findings and recommendations of the stakeholder group to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over agriculture, conservation and forestry matters by March 1, 2025. The joint standing committee has the authority to submit a bill relating to the subject matter of the report to the 132nd Legislature in 2025.

LD 1346 Resolve, Authorizing the Director of the Bureau of Parks and Lands Within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to Lease Certain Land Within Somerset County

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 18 authorizes the Director of the Bureau of Parks and Lands within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to lease to Central Maine Power Company, on such terms and conditions as the director may require, certain property of approximately 0.4 acres on the Coburn Mountain public reserved lands within Upper Enchanted Township, Somerset County originally subject to a lease signed by the bureau in 1999 and on which are located radio telecommunication facilities.

LD 1659 Resolve, Authorizing the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Bureau of Parks and Lands to Enter into Certain Leases

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 46 authorizes the Director of the Bureau of Parks and Lands within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to lease certain state park land and public reserved lands and to enter into a boundary line adjustment agreement with Ms. Elizabeth Franco and Ms. Lynne Cleary to correct an inaccurate boundary line at Lamoine State Park.

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LD 1670 An Act to Strengthen Maine's Agriculture, Food and Forest Economy by Funding the Maine Agriculture, Food and Forest Products Investment Fund and Amending Related Provisions of Law

LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 470 requires the Maine Agriculture, Food System and Forest Products Infrastructure Investment Advisory Board within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to collaborate with the Department of Economic and Community Development and other appropriate agencies and organizational partners to ensure that investment objectives are appropriately targeted and not duplicative and to establish various grant and loan instruments as part of the Maine Agriculture, Food and Forest Products Investment Fund.

The law provides one-time funding of \$500,000 in fiscal year 2024-25 to support public-private partnerships to facilitate strategic investments in the State's agricultural, food and forest products processing and manufacturing industries.

LD 1678 Resolve, Directing the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to Study and Report on Soil Carbon Sequestration Incentive Programs

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 43 directs the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to study and report on soil carbon sequestration incentive programs that can be applied to land in this State, including but not limited to forest land, agricultural land, conservation land, wetlands, and urban and suburban areas and determine possible funding sources that may be used to fund the programs. The department must submit its report, including any recommended legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry no later than February 1, 2024. The committee may report out legislation regarding the report to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.

LD 1767 An Act to Require the University of Maine to Provide Education Regarding Meat and Poultry Processing

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 473 requires the University of Maine within available funding to provide a cooperative extension education program regarding meat and poultry processing. The law provides one-time funding in fiscal year 2024-25 for that purpose.

LD 1770 Resolve, Directing the Board of Pesticides Control to Transition to Electronic Submission of Pesticide Sales and Use Data

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 71 directs the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Board of Pesticides Control to adopt any rules necessary to implement the transition from paper to electronic format of reports required to be submitted to the board pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 1471-G. The board is required to implement a system of electronic data collection that is efficient for those required to submit reports to the board, namely pesticide dealers, commercial applicators and spray contracting firms, and useful to the board and members of the public.

LD 1849 An Act to Ensure Fair and Timely Payment in the Harvesting of Forest Products

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 357 requires an entity that contracts with a person to harvest wood and place the wood roadside so that the entity is able to have the wood hauled away for use or processing to pay the person within 30 days of the person's fulfilling the contract and placing the wood roadside. The law also requires the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry or a wood scaler under contract with the department to conduct random inspections to ensure that entities are complying with this requirement.

LD 1874 An Act to Support Maine Loggers' and Truckers' Right to Work in Maine by Improving Labor Standards

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 380 provides that the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry may obtain certification from a forest certification program for state land only if the program contains certain performance-based indicators that protect forest workers and the program does not require payment to a trade association that is registered with the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices.

LD 1881 An Act Regarding Compensation Fees and Related Conservation Efforts to Protect Soils and Wildlife and Fisheries Habitat from Solar and Wind Energy Development and High-impact Electric Transmission Lines Under the Site Location of Development Laws

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 448 directs the Department of Environmental Protection to establish a solar energy compensation program. The program requires a person who obtains approval under

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the Site Location of Development law in Title 38, also known as Site Law, to construct or cause to be constructed a solar energy development located on high-value agricultural land to pay a compensation fee or other form of compensation for any portion of the development, including associated facilities, that is located on high value agricultural land. The law requires the Department of Environmental Protection, in consultation with the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, to calculate the compensation fee for solar energy development that is located on high-value agricultural land.

The law also requires the Department of Environmental Protection to establish a compensation fee program to fund a compensation project as an alternative means of satisfying requirements related to off-site habitat improvement or preservation that the department determines necessary to mitigate the adverse effects of renewal energy development on wildlife and fisheries habitat to comply with Site Law.

The law directs the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to initiate major substantive rulemaking to define terms such as "high-value agricultural land" and "dual-use agricultural and solar production" and the Department Environmental Protection to initiate major substantive rulemaking to establish a compensation fee program to accept and administer compensation fees under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, sections 484-C and 484-D and to define "wildlife and fisheries habitats" under Title 38, section 484-D, subsection 1, which must include but not be limited to large undeveloped habitat blocks, important wildlife corridors and other habitat types identified in consultation with the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.

The law also provides that a person may not construct, cause to be constructed or operate a solar energy development without a permit from the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry. The law defines "solar energy development" as a development that uses ground-mounted solar arrays and installations to convert solar energy to electrical energy; occupies 5 acres or more; and is wholly or partially located on high-value agricultural land. This requirement applies to solar energy developments on which construction begins after September 1, 2024.

LD 1930 Resolve, to Authorize the Exchange of Interest in Certain Lands Owned by the State in Piscataquis County

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 50 authorizes the exchange of interest in certain state-owned land in Piscataquis County. The law provides that the cost of a survey of the property boundaries and recording costs may not be paid by the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Bureau of Parks and Lands.

LD 1947 An Act to Amend the Food Sovereignty Act

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 420 amends the definition of "direct producer-to-consumer transaction" in the Maine Food Sovereignty Act. The law also provides that a farmers' market may impose more stringent requirements on its sellers than those imposed by municipal, plantation or county ordinances regarding traditional foodways or direct producer-to-consumer transactions.

LD 1969 An Act to Expand the Use of Funds to Support Land Conservation

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 284 eliminates the Land for Maine's Future Fund, replaces it with the Land for Maine's Future Trust Fund and transfers the balance in the Land for Maine's Future Fund. The law requires that the funds transferred be used for the purposes identified in Public Law 2021, chapter 398, Part FFFF, section 8. The Land for Maine's Future Trust Fund may be used for the purposes of the Public Access to Maine Waters Fund, the Maine Working Waterfront Access Protection Fund, the Maine Working Farmland Access and Protection Fund and the new funds established specifically by the law.

The law amends provisions of law affecting the Public Access to Maine Waters Fund, the Maine Working Waterfront Access Protection Fund and the Maine Working Farmland Access and Protection Fund. The law establishes the Conservation and Recreation Fund to achieve the purposes of the former Land for Maine's Future Fund. The law establishes the Conservation Land Management Fund to make capital improvements to and enhance wildlife habitat protection on permanently conserved state, municipal and private conservation lands.

The law clarifies that upon repeal the of the Land for Maine's Future Fund any funds within the Land for Maine's Future Fund, both the Community Conservation Projects Other Special Revenue Funds account and the Land for Maine's Future Fund Other Special Revenue Funds account, are required to be transferred to the Land For Maine's Future Trust Fund.
