LD 57 An Act to Amend Maine's Endangered and Threatened Species List

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 60 makes the following changes to the State's list of endangered and threatened species.

- 1. It removes the box turtle and the rapids clubtail from the endangered species list.
- 2. It adds the Ashton's cuckoo bumble bee and the saltmarsh sparrow to the endangered species list.
- 3. It adds the bank swallow, the Bicknell's thrush, the blackpoll warbler, the cliff swallow, the margined tiger beetle and the tricolored bat to the threatened species list.
- 4. It also makes some taxonomic nomenclature changes.

In addition to the changes made to Maine's Endangered and Threatened Species list, Public Law 2023, chapter 60 adds a requirement that the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters no less frequently than every four years on any recommendations, status updates or changes to the list of species designated as endangered or threatened.

LD 92 An Act to Minimize the Propagation of Invasive Aquatic Plants

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 190 makes the following changes to the laws governing the draining of watercraft upon removal from Maine's inland waters.

- 1. It requires a person immediately before placing on or after removing a watercraft from an inland water body to drain the watercraft and other equipment and to remove or open drain plugs, bailers, valves and other devices to drain the water before that watercraft is transported.
- 2. It exempts emergency response watercraft from these requirements.
- 3. It prohibits draining or releasing water held on or within a watercraft and allowing that water to enter any inland water body of the State if the water in the watercraft is from a different water source.

Public Law 2023, chapter 190 was enacted as an emergency measure effective June 16, 2023.

LD 131 An Act to Clarify and Correct Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Laws

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 228 makes the following changes to sections of Title 12.

- 1. It eliminates provisions relating to the annual reports to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters on deer and moose management.
- 2. It renames the Species Management Education Fund the Fish and Wildlife Management Education Fund and allows funding to be used for education on the management of fish and wildlife and to communicate with the public about department programs. It also removes the requirement in current law that education provided under the fund must include information about how hunting and fishing help to manage specific species.
- 3. It renames the Black Bear Research Fund the Black Bear Research and Management Fund and modifies its purpose to allow the fund to be used for both research and management activities.
- 4. It removes the requirement that a person involved in a hunting incident or a watercraft, snowmobile or all-terrain vehicle crash submit to a mandatory chemical test and removes references to that requirement.
- 5. It provides clarity on how a super pack licensee applies for an antlerless deer permit.
- 6. It exempts members of certain federally recognized Indian nations, bands or tribes from the requirement to complete a bear trapping education course.
- 7. It resolves a conflict in Title 12 regarding the cost of combination licenses.
- 8. It removes references to specific types of personal flotation devices.

LD 189 An Act to Include an Expanded Archery Permit in the Super Pack License Issued by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 49 makes the following changes to Maine's super pack hunting licenses.

1. It allows for the harvesting of six deer including three antlerless deer and one deer of either sex during the special archery season as determined by the commissioner.

2. It increases the fee for a super pack license to \$207 for residents and \$182 for a person holding 2 or more lifetime licenses.

LD 221 An Act Regarding Airboat Noise

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 209 makes the following changes to the laws regarding airboat usage in Maine.

- 1. It extends to September 30, 2025 the prohibition on the operation of a motorboat that exceeds a noise level of 75 decibels between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. and 90 decibels between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m..
- 2. It reconvenes the stakeholder group on airboat noise issues and requires a report to be submitted by January 15, 2025 to the joint standing committees of the Legislature having jurisdiction over marine resources and inland fisheries and wildlife matters that includes the findings and recommendations of the stakeholder group, including any recommended legislation. After receiving the report, the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters may report out a bill relating to airboats to the 132nd Legislature in 2025.

LD 296 An Act to Ensure Municipalities Receive a Higher Percentage of All-terrain Vehicle Registration Fees to Cover Increased Expenses

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 213 increases the fee an agent may charge for processing a snowmobile or all-terrain vehicle registration or renewal registration to not more than \$5.

LD 379 Resolve, Directing the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to Study the Effects of Wake Boats on Shoreline Property and the Environment

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 33 requires the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to establish a stakeholder group to review completed studies relating to wake boats and their effects on shoreline property and the environment paying special attention to issues relating to the types of boats used, the appropriate distance from the shoreline and depth of the body of water, enforcement mechanisms, including fines, and the definition used for "wake boat."

The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall report the findings and recommendations of the stakeholder group to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife no later than February 1, 2024. The committee may report out a bill related to wake boats and their effects on shoreline property and the environment to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.

LD 438 An Act to Clarify and Amend the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Licensing Laws

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 308 makes the following changes to the laws governing licensing and registration by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.

- 1. It provides that all members of the Advisory Board for the Licensing of Guides except state employees are entitled to receive compensation and increases the daily rate of compensation for examiners of the Advisory Board for the Licensing of Guides and the Advisory Board for the Licensing of Taxidermists from \$50 per day to \$150 per day and per diem.
- 2. It increases the guide examination fee from \$100 to \$125 and the taxidermist application fee from \$50 to \$125 and clarifies that the taxidermist application fee also applies to examinations for general classification.
- 3. It repeals the provision of law that allows a guide applicant to take a 2nd test for free.
- 4. It clarifies that the owner of a snowmobile is not required to register that snowmobile if it is operated on land that the owner lives on or land that the snowmobile operator owns or leases.
- 5. It increases the fee for a pheasant hunting permit from \$18 to \$29 and increases the amount that is retained by the authorized agent of the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife from \$1 to \$2.

LD 481 An Act to Allow the Deferral of a Moose Hunting Permit If More than One Permit Is Awarded Within the Same Household

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 127 allows a holder of a valid moose hunting permit to defer the permit to the next hunting season if another person in the permit holder's household also holds a valid moose hunting permit for the same hunting season.

LD 482 An Act to Extend the Time for Youth Deer Hunting

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 191 makes the following changes to Maine's youth deer hunting day.

- 1. It establishes a 2-day youth deer hunting period for 2023 to begin 8 days before the start of the regular deer hunting season.
- 2. It directs the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to examine the impact of an additional dedicated youth deer hunting day on the deer population and wildlife management goals.
- 3. It directs the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to report to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife the findings and recommendations of the examination and authorizes the committee to report out legislation on those findings in 2024.

Public Law 2023, chapter 191 was enacted as an emergency measure effective June 16, 2023.

LD 491 Resolve, to Require the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to Develop a Plan for Communication Regarding Certain Municipal Regulation

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 26 requires the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to develop and report by January 1, 2024 to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife a plan to inform municipalities about the limits on local regulation of hunting, fishing and trapping and the operation of watercraft, snowmobiles and all-terrain vehicles and a distribution scheme for the information.

LD 497 An Act to Prohibit the Use of Personal Watercraft on Keyes Pond in the Town of Sweden

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 106 prohibits the use of personal watercraft on Keyes Pond in the Town of Sweden.

LD 531 An Act to Add Gray Squirrels and Red Squirrels to the Species List for the Open Training Season for Hunting Dogs

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 134 adds gray squirrels and red squirrels to the list of those animals upon which a person may train dogs during the open training season for dogs.

Public Law 2023, chapter 134 was enacted as an emergency measure effective June 8, 2023.

LD 547 An Act to Amend the Hunting Laws as They Pertain to the Training of Dogs

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 172 removes the prohibition on training hunting dogs on bear in those portions of Washington County and Hancock County that are situated south of Route 9 until May 1, 2025 for residents who have permission to train on land used for wild blueberry production. It also requires the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters any recommendations resulting from this change to the 132nd Legislature in 2025.

Public Law 2023, chapter 172 was enacted as an emergency measure effective June 15, 2023.

LD 660 Resolve, Naming a Pond in the Town of New Gloucester as MacDonald Pond

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 16 names a pond in the Town of New Gloucester MacDonald Pond.

LD 661 Resolve, Naming a Pond in Elm Stream Township as Plummer Pond

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 35 names a pond in Elm Stream Township Plummer Pond.

LD 732 An Act to Prohibit Off-trail Operation of a Snowmobile in an Area Closed to Offtrail Operation

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 163 prohibits a person from operating a snowmobile off a snowmobile trail identified by the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Bureau of Parks and Lands as having been funded by the Snowmobile Trail Fund, in an area that is posted as being closed to off-trail snowmobile operation. It provides for a fine of not less than \$100 and not more than \$500 for the first violation of the prohibition and that a violation after three or more civil violations of the inland fisheries and wildlife laws is a Class E crime.

LD 831 Resolve, Directing the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to Examine Issues Related to Moose Hunting Seasons

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 36 directs the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to examine issues and make recommendations related to the timing and length of moose hunting seasons and strategies to reduce conflicts during moose hunting seasons.

LD 958 An Act to Expand Protections to Maine's Loons from Lead Poisoning by Prohibiting the Sale and Use of Certain Painted Lead Jigs

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 231 makes it illegal to sell or offer for sale painted lead jigs weighing one ounce or less or measuring 2 1/2 inches or less in length beginning September 1, 2024 and illegal to use such jigs beginning September 1, 2026.

LD 1186 Resolve, Directing the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to Develop a Hunting and Fishing Software Application

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 113 directs the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to develop a software application that a person can download onto the person's electronic device to allow the person to access the department's publicly accessible website pages regarding hunting and fishing information, licenses and permits.

LD 1319 An Act to Exempt Certain Boat Operators from Having to Become Maine Guides

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 226 makes the following changes to the laws governing the operation of a watercraft without a guide license as an employee of a seasonal business engaged in instruction in recreational activities.

- 1. It allows a person who has completed an approved boater safety education course and is certified in first aid to operate a watercraft without a guide license as an employee of a seasonal business engaged in instruction in recreational activities during the 2023 recreational boating season.
- 2. It directs the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to establish a stakeholder group to examine the guide requirements for recreational sports.
- 3. It directs the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to report the findings and recommendations of the stakeholder group to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife no later than January 15, 2024. The committee may report out a bill related to recreational guide requirements to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.

Public Law 2023, chapter 226 was enacted as an emergency measure effective June 20, 2023.

LD 1525 An Act to Allow for a Suspension of Licenses and Permits Issued Under the Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Laws for a Deferred Disposition or Written Filing Agreement

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 265 allows for the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to suspend any license issued by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife for a deferred disposition or when there is a written filing agreement with the State.

LD 1807 An Act to Implement the Recommendations of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife's Report on Boater Safety Education

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 206 makes the following changes to the laws governing boater safety education requirements in Maine.

- 1. It defines recreational boating as being primarily used for pleasure and excludes from that definition the use of motorboats carrying passengers for hire.
- 2. It applies the boater safety and education course requirement for inland waters to territorial waters defined by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 6001.
- 3. It adds exemptions to the requirement of a boater safety and education course to possessors of valid or expired United States merchant marine licensure documents, persons test driving a motorboat as part of a possible purchase, persons renting a motorboat who have completed a temporary boater safety course and noncitizens who arrive by sea and are temporarily using Maine's territorial waters.

LD 1826 An Act to Designate Deer Wintering Areas Under the Jurisdiction of the Bureau of Parks and Lands

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 187 allows the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Bureau of Parks and Lands to designate, pursuant to a habitat management agreement with the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, deer wintering areas on parcels of land under the jurisdiction of the bureau that are high-quality deer wintering habitat with a documented history of significant use by deer. It requires the bureau to manage the designated area with deer conservation as the highest management priority and permits the bureau to manage the designated area to benefit other wildlife species that rely on mature softwood forests, and the designated areas are eligible for funding from the Maine Deer Management Fund. It also directs the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Bureau of Parks and Lands and the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to survey public lands in the northern, eastern and western regions of the State for unmapped deer wintering areas for inclusion as designated deer wintering areas by the bureau.

LD 1868 Resolve, to Name 2 Brooks in the Town of Orient

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 48 names two brooks in the town of Orient.

- 1. The brook in the Town of Orient, Aroostook County, that flows under Boundary 7 Road and into MacAllister Cove of Grand Lake is named the Calais Bound Brook.
- 2. The brook in the Town of Orient, Aroostook County, that flows under Boundary 9 Road and Route 1, towards Skagrock Brook is named the Bangor Bound Brook.

LD 1879 An Act to Align Laws Governing Crossbow Hunting with Those Governing Archery Hunting

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 239 makes the following changes to the laws governing the use of crossbow and archery hunting.

- 1. It defines "archery equipment" to mean a bow or crossbow.
- 2. It provides that a person commits a Class E crime if while within the jurisdiction of the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Bureau of Parks and Lands the person discharges archery equipment within 300 feet of any picnic area, designated camping area, parking area, building, shelter or boat launching site or in violation of park rules or in areas closed to hunting by rule, law or ordinance.
- 3. It changes references in the hunting laws to "bow and arrow" and "bow and arrow or crossbow" to "archery equipment."
- 4. It provides that except as provided in the laws governing the muzzle-loading-only deer hunting season, a person may hunt any wild bird or wild animal with archery equipment during any open season on that bird or animal if the person holds a valid archery hunting license. It repeals the laws governing open seasons for hunting with a crossbow, issuance of crossbow permits and crossbow permits and fees.
- 5. It provides that beginning January 1, 2024, a person who previously held a crossbow permit is eligible to obtain an archery hunting license.
- 6. It adds instruction on all types of archery equipment to the archery hunting education program.
- 7. It removes the discharge of a crossbow within 100 yards of a building or residential dwelling without the permission of the owner from the laws governing prohibited discharges and allows the discharge of a crossbow on a landowner's own land for any purpose, including target practice and hunting.
- 8. It provides that a person may not discharge an arrow or bolt from archery equipment when on land of another person and within 100 yards of a building or residential dwelling on that land without the permission of the owner of that building or residential dwelling or cause an arrow or bolt from archery equipment to pass across the land of another person and within 100 yards of a building or residential dwelling or residential dwelling or that building or residential dwelling or that building or residential dwelling.
- 9. It clarifies the laws governing hunting or shooting from motor vehicles.

- 10. It specifies that there is a continual closed season on deer on the Cranberry Isles in Hancock County, except that a person may hunt deer on the Cranberry Isles with a shotgun or bow in accordance with applicable laws and rules.
- 11. It provides that a person may not hunt wild hares or rabbits in any manner except by the ordinary method of shooting with guns, archery equipment or by falconry.
- 12. It provides that a person may take suckers by the use of a hand spear, by archery equipment or by snagging.
- 13. It repeals the laws governing the crossbow hunting education program.
- 14. It removes references to crossbows from the archery hunter education requirements.
