The Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry (ACF) Committee is pleased to submit the following report for the proposed 2024-25 biennial budget initiatives relating to agriculture, conservation and forestry (see attached report-back document).

The ACF Committee voted unanimously in favor of all initiatives and corresponding language parts with the exception of one initiative and corresponding language part relating to one-time funding for the distribution of payments to address escalating production costs to Maine dairy farmers who meet specific milk production costs (see Ref. #47 on Page 18 and language Part HHH on Pages 29 and 30 of the report-back document). The ACF Committee unanimously votes in favor of providing one-time funding of \$7,000,000, rather than \$3,000,000 as proposed in the supplemental budget bill, in fiscal year ending 2024.

In addition, the ACF Committee voted unanimously in favor of the following two additions to the supplemental budget bill.

1) The first addition is to continue and make permanent one position which was established in Public Law 2023, chapter 448 (LD 1881, An Act Regarding Compensation Fees and Related Conservation Efforts to Protect Soils and Wildlife and Fisheries Habitat from Solar and Wind Energy Development and High-impact Electric Transmission Lines Under the Site Location of Development Laws). Public Law 2023, chapter 448 establishes one limited-period Environmental Licensing Supervisor position and provides funding for related All Other costs. The position ends June 7, 2025.

See attached email dated March 7, 2024 for details. This initiative, which is under the Bureau of Agriculture 0393, is on Page 1 of the email.

2) The second addition is to include one ongoing permanent position, which is also proposed in LD 579, An Act to Support Farmland Conservation. LD 579, which is currently on the Appropriations Table, proposes to establish one Resource Management Coordinator position and provides funding for related All Other costs.

The initiatives under the Bureau of Agriculture 0393 and DACF Administration 0401 relating to this addition are on Page 2 of the attached email dated March 7, 2024.

Furthermore, the following language, which is also included in LD 579, creates a separate account within the Maine Working Farmland Access and Protection Program and corresponds with this second addition.

Sec. . 7 MRSA §164, sub-§5 is enacted to read:

5. Funding. A separate nonlapsing, interest-bearing account, administered by the department, is established in the department to support public-private partnerships to carry out the purposes of the program. The account consists of money appropriated or allocated to it or received from any private or public source.

Finally, the ACF Committee would like to emphasize the importance of LD 2212, An Act to Strengthen Maine's Agriculture, Food System and Forest Products Infrastructure Investment. The Maine Agriculture, Food and Forest Products Investment Fund is established and administered by the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to support public-private partnerships to, among other things, facilitate strategic investments in Maine's agricultural, food and forest products process and manufacturing industries, including value-added products. In particular, the committee amendment to LD 2212, which is unanimous, provides ongoing funding from the General Fund for one Public Service Manager II position and associated all Other costs for administrative support and for program implementation. The ACF Committee strongly supports this new position within the department which will provide essential staffing resources needed to get this important program off the ground.

Workers Compensation premiums for call-when-needed fire fighters (CWNFF) haven't been invoiced to the Maine Forest Service (MFS) since 2020, when MFS switched coverage from Risk Management to the State Workers Compensation Program. The FY24 invoice to insure the CWNFF totals \$17,640 (98 volunteers, \$180/volunteer) representing a \$3,889 increase in premiums compared to 2020.
