LD 402 Resolve, to Rename Bridges in the Towns of Limerick, Hiram and Limington

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 176 directs the Department of Transportation to designate a bridge in the town of Limerick as the Sokokis Lake Veterans Memorial Bridge, a bridge in the town of Hiram as the Hiram Veterans Memorial Bridge, and a bridge in the town of Limington as the Limington Veterans Memorial Bridge.

LD 1640 An Act Directing the Department of Transportation to Adopt Rules Regarding Corrosion Mitigation Methods for Steel Bridges

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 657 directs the Department of Transportation to adopt routine technical rules governing corrosion mitigation methods for steel bridges wholly under the control of the State and specifies that the rules must include, but are not limited to, establishing processes for ensuring that corrosion mitigation activities are carried out in accordance with established federal corrosion mitigation standards and under the supervision of personnel who are industry-trained and industry-certified in corrosion mitigation methods on an appropriate substrate or surface; requiring plans to prevent environmental degradation that might result from corrosion mitigation activities; and requiring compliance with all applicable state and federal rules and regulations and corrosion mitigation standards.

LD 2049 An Act to Increase Safety for Child Welfare Services Workers

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 542 exempts unmarked motor vehicles used regularly for work protecting the welfare of children from having to display a special registration license plate.

LD 2056 Resolve, Designating Route 127 in Arrowsic the Private Merwin A. Delano, Jr. Memorial Highway

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 132 directs the Department of Transportation to designate the portion of Route 127 in the town of Arrowsic as the Private Merwin A. Delano, Jr. Memorial Highway.

LD 2072 An Act to Amend the Laws Governing Motor Vehicles

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 634 amends various sections of statute regarding motor vehicles in Title 29-A of the Maine Revised Statutes in the following ways.

- 1. It amends the definition of "antique auto" to include an automobile that is more than 35 years old or is less than 35 years of age and more than 25 years of age and was registered in the State as an antique vehicle prior to January 2025.
- 2. It amends the definition of "antique motorcycle" to include a motorcycle that is more than 35 years old or is less than 35 years of age and more than 25 years of age and was registered in the State as an antique motorcycle prior to January 2025.
- 3. It eliminates the provision that allows a person during a nonplate issue year to reserve an unexpired registration plate number for more than six months.
- 4. It clarifies that specialty plate sponsors registering with the Secretary of State after the specialty plate moratorium must be affiliated with a state department.
- 5. It eliminates the authority of the Secretary of State to issue unassigned temporary registration permits to licensed vehicle auction businesses.
- 6. It clarifies that a set of disabled veteran plates are an option for a veteran who has lost both legs or the use of both legs when the veteran receives a registration fee and excise tax exemption.
- 7. It clarifies that the Secretary of State may issue a registration certificate and special designating plates for more than one vehicle owned by certain disabled veterans.
- 8. It allows for the issuance of titles for semitrailers no more than 25 years of age.
- 9. It requires titles issued to motor vehicles over 25 years of age to be warranty titles in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29-A, section 651, subsection 3.
- 10. It allows a first lienholder participating in the electronic lien titling program to request that a paper certificate of title or salvage be printed and mailed to an alternate address.
- 11. It requires that all fines and fees related to dealer licensing be paid for a dealer license to be issued or retained.
- 12. It requires dealers to post their document preparation fees on all vehicles.
- 13. It allows a licensed towing business to be issued transporter plates and a license to transport a vehicle owned by or in the custody of that owner or business.

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- 14. It requires dealers to maintain a copy of any purchase and sale agreements for a minimum of five years.
- 15. It clarifies that specific dealer plates may be used only for that type of vehicle.
- 16. It clarifies the type of large four-wheel drive trucks that may be operated with an equipment dealer plate.
- 17. It eliminates the requirement that records of vehicles sold by vehicle auction businesses be submitted to the Secretary of State.
- 18. It requires that all fines and fees related to dealer and recycler licensing be paid for a recycler license to be issued or retained.
- 19. It prohibits a person who is not a recycler from operating a business that deals in the sale of catalytic converters that have been removed from motor vehicles.
- 20. It requires the Secretary of State to use the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's drug and alcohol clearinghouse when issuing, upgrading, renewing or transferring a commercial driver's license or learner's permit.
- 21. It allows the Secretary of State to accept a recently expired United States passport as proof of legal presence for United States citizens when issuing a driver's license.
- 22. It increases the length of time a motorcycle rider education instructor license is valid.
- 23. It clarifies that the owner of a driver education school must file with the Secretary of State a certificate showing that each vehicle used during driving instruction is covered by certain insurance policies.
- 24. It allows the Secretary of State to accept a recently expired United States passport as proof of legal presence for United States citizens when issuing a nondriver identification card.
- 25. It clarifies that a dealer may transport an uninspected vehicle to an automobile auction or another licensed vehicle dealer as long as it is safe to operate on a public way.
- 26. It expands the type of medical professionals that may provide a certificate to exempt a person from seatbelt requirements.
- 27. It eliminates the requirement for a school bus operator endorsement for drivers of a multifunction school activity bus and provides that the driver must be at least 21 years of age and have held a driver's license for at least two years.

LD 2173 Resolve, to Rename the Interstate 295 Interchange in the Town of Freeport the Matthew MacMillan Bridge

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 140 corrects an erroneous designation and location of an interchange in the town of Freeport and renames the interchange as the Matthew MacMillan Bridge. The correction is retroactive to June 29, 2023, the effective date of Resolve 2023, chapter 1 which contained the erroneous designation and location.

Resolve 2023, chapter 140 was finally passed as an emergency measure effective March 14, 2024.

LD 2183 Resolve, to Correct the Designation of a Bridge in Canaan to Be Named After Staff Sergeant Richard Gerald Salsbury

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 131 corrects an erroneous designation and location of a bridge in the town of Canaan and renames the bridge as the Staff Sergeant Richard Gerald Salsbury Bridge. The correction is retroactive to June 29, 2023, the effective date of Resolve 2023, chapter 2, which contained the erroneous designation and location.

Resolve 2023, chapter 131 was finally passed as an emergency measure effective February 29, 2024.

LD 2190 An Act to Make Allocations from Maine Turnpike Authority Funds for the Maine Turnpike Authority for the Calendar Year Ending December 31, 2025

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Private and Special Law 2023, chapter 19 makes allocations from gross revenues of the Maine Turnpike Authority for the payment of the authority's operating expenses for the calendar year ending December 31, 2025 in accordance with the requirements of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 23, section 1961, subsection 6.

LD 2229 An Act to Make Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government, Highway Fund and Other Funds and to Change Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 2024 and June 30, 2025

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 645 makes supplemental appropriations and allocations for the expenditures of State Government, Highway Fund and other funds and changes certain provisions of the law necessary to the proper operations of State Government for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2024 and June 30, 2025.

Public Law 2023, chapter 645 was enacted as an emergency measure effective April 22, 2024.

LD 2239 Resolve, to Rename a Bridge in the Town of Mechanic Falls the Bill Dunlop Memorial Bridge

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 161 directs the Department of Transportation to rename a bridge in the town of Mechanic Falls as the Bill Dunlop Memorial Bridge.

Resolve 2023, chapter 161 was finally passed as an emergency measure effective April 2, 2024.

LD 2281 An Act to Reconvene a Driver Education Working Group to Evaluate Hardships to Underserved Populations and Low-income Families

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 595 reconvenes a working group to study potential solutions regarding the cost of and access to driver education for underserved populations and low-income families. The working group is required to submit a report no later than February 3, 2025 that includes its findings and recommendations for presentation to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters, which is authorized to submit legislation related to the report to the 132nd Legislature in 2025.

Public Law 2023, chapter 595 was enacted as an emergency measure effective April 9, 2024.

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
