Hello Lindsay,

I know I am beyond the deadline but I did want to respond to this.

We are putting a bill in from IFW to try to address requests for large lists of data that is clearly for commercial resale to help advertise a business. They ask for a whole list of 100's of thousands of names and their contact information for boat, ATV or snowmobile registrations or for hunting or fishing licenses. We have a policy that guides our staff to charge .03 cents per name \$5 for a lookup for just a few records when FOAA isn't cited but when someone specifically cites FOAA we provide the information free if it takes less than 2 hours.

We also have some requestors who know they want multiple sets of information and make an initial request and then when we respond and they don't get what they want they say they want to make a new request multiple times. We charge the \$25/hour but when they say they're making a "new" request do we use the 2 hours free of charge again so they basically continue to get free FOAA searches? These are some examples that have been very time consuming and frustrating for us.
